Library Construction Begins

It's exciting times with the construction of the new Yankalilla Library set to commence in the first week of February.

The journey to build a new Library has been 7 years in the making and after much community input, local building designer Harmonic Design has delivered a modern functional design which integrates old and new, celebrating the past and building for the future.

Council has appointed Building Solutions SA to construct the purpose-built facility and associated road and carpark upgrades at the current site of 181 Main South Road Yankalilla.

Federal Member for Mayo Rebekha Sharkie secured \$250,000 of grant funding towards the fit out of the facility. Ms Sharkie said, "The new library will have improved mobility access, more engaging multi-use spaces and will be fitted out with upgraded technology".

This exciting project aims to be completed by the end of this financial year.

Mayor's Corner

Happy New Year and Welcome to 2022.

While I may have only had one meeting over the Christmas/New Year's break, there have been many calls to staff and emails to rate payers.

Elected Members, at the December Council meeting, endorsed the Yankalilla Economic Development Strategy – Draft Action Plan, based on the Strategy's stated 'Opportunities for Action'. The Action Plan was developed with the Structure Plan and Strategic Plan objectives and long-term targets in mind.

Council have still been active, progressing the many projects and preparing for our influx of visitors to our district.

The Forktree Road construction and the long-awaited bituminising is well under way, whilst the construction of Cheeseman Street stormwater infrastructure, resealing with sustainable asphalt and rain gardens will commence in February 2022.

Council has been successful with an application of a grant for an E-Trike to enable those with disabilities to access trails within our district.

This E-Trike is one of 3 electric-assist wheelchairs that will be piloted as part of the Opening the Door to

Nature project. Yankalilla Council is the lead proponent and we have partnered with City of Mitcham and the LEGATUS group of Councils (Central region).

You can read more about the E-Trike Pilot Program and how you can get involved later in this edition of In The Loop.

There is a new Cyclax Fixit Bike Repair Station & Pump to be installed at the Pump Track. The station includes all the basic tools necessary to carry out simple bike repairs and maintenance, such as changing a flat tyre or adjusting brakes and derailleurs. The bike can be attached to the stand, allowing the pedals and wheels to spin freely while repairs are made. Installation of this should occur in the next couple of weeks. Watch this space!

The Christmas Light Show was a success with The Sands group from Normanville winning the event. This event has now had over 19,000 views on Facebook over the last 2 years.

The New Year's event at the show grounds had over 400 attendees over the night, but even a power outage couldn't dampen spirits. Plans to bring back a new and improved New Year's Eve Pageant in 2023 is already in the planning by members of the community.

E-Trikes - Opening the Door to Nature



District Council of Yankalilla have recently taken delivery of the first of three eTrikes which will enable independent wheelchair access to our tracks and trails throughout the region. The eTrike is designed for

active users who want to go further, faster or tackle more challenging terrain and for those who would like some assistance to travel off road.

This eTrike is one of 3 electric-assist wheelchairs that will be piloted as part of the Opening the Door to Nature project. We are also awaiting delivery of three MT Push (attendant) chairs.

Yankalilla Council is the lead proponent in this project and we have partnered with City of Mitcham and the LEGATUS group of Councils (Central region).

The pilot program will identify trails

suitable for short (induction) and extended (ramble) experiences and develop a comprehensive toolkit for host organisations and users.

The three eTrikes will be deployed as a group at each partner location, on a rotation basis with one MT Push available at each partner location throughout the duration of the trial.

Council are looking for Expressions of Interest for people with a lived experience of a disability who would like to be involved with the Pilot Program. Enquiries can be made to Lisa Pearson, Group Manager Economy, Tourism & Community on 8558 0200.

He's introduced spinal management courses, worked on building repair and maintenance programs (and fundraising initiatives to support the same), assisted in arranging for Normanville SLSC to host large lifesaving competitions bring much activity and revenue to our area. Most importantly he's engaged many young people to consider the important role of surf lifesaving and beach safety and awareness. His community spirit extends well beyond the SLSC and he's always willing to lend a hand, a tool or time to local and community projects and initiatives.

Young Citizen of the Year – Bonnie Willsmore

Bonnie is an active member of the Yankalilla Cricket Club, Football Club and Netball Club. She volunteers her time as a committee member, social media manager and organises fundraising and social events for all clubs while also finding time to coach and umpire juniors at the Netball Club. Bonnie has instigated a number of inclusive & charitable events for the Yankalilla Cricket Club such as "Ashes & Lashes" – a fun, social event designed to bring parents, siblings, wives & girlfriends of our local cricketers together to strengthen the family friendly club culture. She has also been actively involved in the Cricket Clubs annual "Pink Day" event, an event that is inclusive for the whole DCY community, aiming to raise funds for the Jane McGrath

Foundation (for Breast Cancer Research).

She has recently coordinated a local touch football competition that is open to all members of the community – encouraging healthy, active and social wellbeing within the community. Bonnie has worked tirelessly for many years behind the scenes for multiple clubs and should be commended for her efforts.

Community Event of the Year – Yankalilla Classic Motor Show

The Yankalilla & Districts Lion's Club ran this successful inaugural family friendly event amidst the everchanging COVID climate, showcasing our district to the classic motoring public. The event saw 217 vehicle registrations, as well as 1150 additional adult attendees. Funds raised – exceeding \$10,000, will be distributed to projects and charities including; Lions Prostrate Cancer, Ovarian Cancer Research, Yankalilla Scouts and various projects supporting our local Schools and students.

Active Citizen Award – Lauren Barrington

Lauren is the current Chairperson of the Cape Jervis Progress Association, a member of the Cape Jervis Community Club and was a member of the "Light Up the Cape" Festival Fleurieu committee. Lauren has also written multiple grant applications to achieve positive outcomes for Cape Jervis.

Lauren has been the driving force behind several events at Cape Jervis, including a 'Colour Run' as part of the Festival Fleurieu – Kids Club activities, and assisting with bringing the 'Light Up the Cape' Festival Fleurieu event to the Cape. Lauren has also applied for multiple grants to upgrade the playground at the Community Club, securing multiple quotes to have a public toilet installed at the Community Club, liaised with State and Federal Ministers to advocate for an upgrade to the Port at Cape Jervis, and regularly attends the local Council meetings to keep updated on decisions made for our community. Lauren has been instrumental in fundraising activities to allow beautification projects in the Cape Jervis area to be possible.

Mayor's Award – Nathan Ide

It has been a hard year for everyone, but Nathan Ide has been an inspiration. Through the guiding principle of acting locally whilst thinking globally, through innovation, networking and building an inclusive and mutually cooperative spirit with the District. The new location has been well received again this year and enables Council to continue to host an Australia Day Event in a COVID-Safe way.

Council welcomed special guests; Senator Don Farrell – Shadow Special Minister of State, Shadow Minister for Sport and Tourism, Shadow Minister Assisting the Leader of the Opposition and Senator for South Australia, Member of the

Upper House Ian Hunter MLC, Amy Williams – Liberal Candidate for Mawson, Melissa Smith – District Commissioner for Scouts SA, Trudy Noack – Yankalilla Area School and our guest speaker for the day Australia Day Ambassador Gabrielle Kelly AM.

Citizen of the Year awards were presented to local stand out citizens, as well as the presentation of our Community Grant Recipients.

Mayor Rothwell also had the privilege of welcoming three new Australian Citizens to the District.

Council was once again fortunate to be successful with a grant application

for over \$17,000 through the National Australia Day Foundation. This has enabled Council to provide additional shades to support social distancing, whilst being sunsmart, additional display materials, as well as more hand sanitiser stations which will be available for community use as part of the Event Trailer Hire through the Visitor Information Centre.

Thanks must go to our volunteer COVID Marshals from various sporting clubs throughout the region. Council has made a donation to their respective clubs in recognition of their assistance in ensuring our safety and compliance during these uncertain times.

Community Grants Awarded

Gouda News for Cheeseman Street as Rebuild from Recycled Plastics Begins

The District Council of Yankalilla have engaged Neo Infrastructure SA to undertake the construction of Cheeseman Street, Normanville. These works consist of; construction of new road pavement and kerb, as well as planted rain gardens in locations along the road to assist in stormwater quality improvements and flow control. Works within Cheeseman Street will complete upgrades previously undertaken within Field Street, Herbert Street, and Heathcote Street.

The final asphalt seal will utilise a "TonerPlas" modified Asphalt, which for Cheeseman Street will comprise of approximately 185,000 plastic shopping bag equivalents and waste toner from 4375 printer cartridges.

Preliminary works within Cheeseman Street commenced late January 2022 with the aim to complete construction by late March 2022, weather permitting.



What do Cape Jervis, Yankalilla, Glossy Black Cockatoos, Beer and Ashes Test Cricket have in common?

Hills and Fleurieu residents had some extra skin in the game when tuning into watch the Aussie Men's Cricket that recently finished. Every four that was hit by an Australian batsman guaranteed the planting of four native plants at Cape Jervis Coastal Reserve - with some of the tubestock grown locally at the Fleurieu Coast Community Nursery at Yankalilla and seeds sourced by Blackwood Seeds.

In September, 4 Pines became the official beer partner of the Australian men's cricket team for the 2021/2022 summer of cricket. As part of its commitment to Brew Better, 4 Pines has partnered with Landcare Australia to plant four trees for every four scored by the men's national team across all three formats of the game this summer. The brewing company has committed to fund the planting of 44,444 native Australian trees, shrubs and groundcovers at the Cape Jervis Coastal Reserve.

The Hills and Fleurieu region is one of South Australia's most ecologically diverse regions, home to half the state's species of native plants and three-quarters of its native bird species. Planting 44,444 native trees, shrubs and groundcovers across 44 hectares in this strategic location will enhance landscape connectivity, improve biodiversity and provide long term habitat for threatened species including the Glossy Black Cockatoo.
