New Cabins Designed For Success

The District Council of Yankalilla has revealed the design and configuration of the 23 new singlestory cabins to be constructed at the Jetty Caravan Park as part of the Normanville Foreshore and Jetty Caravan Park Masterplan. Council believes the designs present an attractive new accommodation offering in the Fleurieu Peninsula with the potential to attract yearround interest.

A total of six cabins styles have been selected to meet a diverse range of accommodation needs, ranging from the open-plan studio-style

Beachcomer range to the spacious Beach Breeze two-bedroom cabins that have verandas perfect for those who like to entertain al fresco. Three cabins, in The Tide range, have full disability access whilst other configurations include Jetty View, Normanville, and The Dune which are all two-bedroom cabins ideal for families, couples or groups of friends.

District Council of Yankalilla CEO Nigel Morris said that the cabin configurations were selected with the view of offering choice, convenience and quality accommodation, but also affordability in what is one of the most tranquil and naturally beautiful settings on the Fleurieu Peninsula.

"It's important to note that the Jetty Caravan Park is a Councilowned establishment," explained Mr. Morris. "The new cabin designs were finalised with one overarching thing in mind and that is to increase revenue generation from the asset for the benefit of rate-payers," explained Mr. Morris.

"The 23 new cabins add tremendous value to our area masterplan and ultimately to the economy of our community as a whole."

Single-use Plastics Legislation Stage 2

South Australians are continuing their commitment to protecting the environment with stage 2 of the Single-use and Other Plastic Products (Waste Avoidance) Act 2020 coming into effect on March 1, 2022. Now is the time to prepare so we can ensure the best environmental outcome for our 'clean and green' state.

From March 1, 2022, expanded polystyrene cups, bowls, plates, clamshell containers and all oxodegradable plastic products will be prohibited from sale, supply, and distribution. Oxo-degradable products are also prohibited from production and manufacture in South Australia.

CEO's Corner

Ask the CEO (Nigel Morris)

Q1: Can you please tell me why no trees have been planted on the roadside kerb on Main Street from the council offices towards the council depot? This area is very neglected, the weeds only get sprayed when I ask them too. The footpath only gets mended when I ring up to complain. The trees overhanging the footpath (where there are footpaths) only get trimmed if they are inferring with powerlines. The streets only get swept when there are tourists expected. - Karen

Response: We are gradually greening our streets, there are many communities across the district which want improvements to their towns. Our Operations staff have requested a budget for streetscape investigations for the 22/23 budget, should this be approved by the Elected Body, we would be happy to review the Yankalilla Main Street area as part of those investigations.

The area on and around Main Street Yankalilla is sprayed by our Parks and Gardens team on a quarterly basis (Twice leading into spring), but they also whipper snip, hand remove & or spot spray as they determine is required.

The footpath is only attended to on an ad-hoc basis, however, we have patched multiple sites as a result of staff identification, normally resulting from one or more of the other actions we need to attend to in the area as well as a result from customer requests. Please continue to report any hazards to us.

The trees on and around Main Street Yankalilla are trimmed as required to meet clearance standards set out in the Road Safety Act. Powerline tree trimming is completed by SA Power networks contractors. There are also multiple hedges and bushes along this stretch of footpath network which are trimmed back to allow reasonable and accessible pathways for our customers. This is completed twice yearly. Again, if there are any hazards please report them to us.

The streets on and around Main Street Yankalilla are swept on a quarterly schedule, completed by a contractor. While we do complete a sweep in peak season to present the town in a neat condition to benefits local traders and residents, the streets are swept quarterly.

Q2: There are too many staff in the council to pay each week and the wages are too high for those at the top! My personal opinion is that Nobody should be working at the council if they don't live in the district council of Yankalilla. - Karen

Response: At our last review Council had 70 individual employees (some part time), 67 live on the Fleurieu Peninsula and 3 live outside the Fleurieu. We try to hire local where possible, our last three hires have been from within the Council area.

Interestingly, I have known of locals that have worked at other Council areas.

I have previously been asked why I don't live locally? I was appointed by the Elected Members after an extensive campaign, and although the other candidates were kept in confidence, I have been told no locals made the final interview process. The Elected Members chose the person that they felt could best serve the community.

Although due to dual family circumstances I am unable to live in the District, I have a policy of buying local where possible, attending every community group meeting I'm invited to, am the last to leave every function, come down on weekends and without living in a specific location or belonging to any clubs within the District is never accused of a bias. It is the role of the Chief Executive to present reports to the Elected Body for consideration to make the major decisions. All the Elected Members are local.

I have often wondered if I lived in the District if this would lead to other perceptions, for example, if I lived at Cape Jervis and weeding was done near my place would I received feedback that weeding was only done because it was near my house.

Mr. Morris cites statistics which reveal that for every dollar of caravan park income generated in Australia, \$1.38 of local economic activity is generated (The Caravan Park Industry Association of Australia).

construction materials are very maintenance friendly. The first of the new cabins will be arriving onsite in the third quarter of this year," added Mr. Morris.

The Jetty Caravan Park "Cabin Project" originally had a budget

"All cabins will be single storey with elevations kept to a minimum with a maximum height of 50cm, as requested by residents during Council's community consultation process. The cabin design and of \$4,090,900 with equal funding coming from Council and State Government's Local Government Infrastructure Partnership Program. In October 2021, the District Council of Yankalilla secured additional funding of \$2,045,450 through the Federal Government's Building Better Regions funding program in recognition of the merits of the project and to maximise its intended socio-economic contribution to Normanville and surrounds. With the three tiers of government now equally contributing to the expanded \$6,136,650 project the Cabin Project will now not only deliver the full 23 new fully furnished cabins, but the funding will also be applied to improve local infrastructure in the park such as underground services, fire hydrants, electricity upgrades, fencing, landscaping and recreational amenities.

"We are confident that the Cabin Project will be successful and generate revenue for the community while adding significant economic value to surrounding local businesses," explained Mr. Morris.

The Cabin Project is one element of the District Council of Yankalilla's overall Normanville Foreshore and Jetty Caravan Park Masterplan which also comprises of a combined new rebuild of the Surf Club and Kiosk, carparking, green space (lawns), nature play playground, dune restoration, beach interface and accessibility upgrades.
