



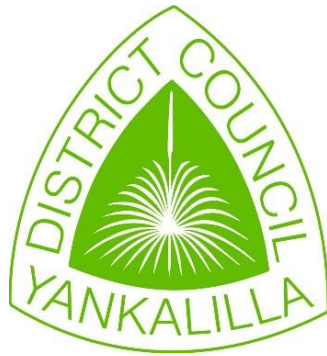

Welcome to the District Council of Yankalilla Cemeteries

The District Council of Yankalilla has two Cemeteries within the Council area under their care and control.

Yankalilla Council

Bullaparinga Cemetery
230 Old Chambers Road, Bullaparinga

Both the Yankalilla Cemetery and the Bullaparinga Cemetery were established in 1858. The cemeteries offer a pleasant 'country cemetery' feel and are valued by members of the community. Both Cemeteries have a high historical value for the local area as well as the state.

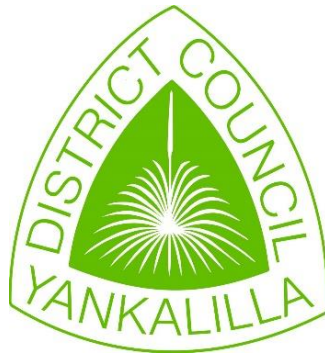


Aerial map Yankalilla Cemetery

The cemeteries are surrounded by native bush land and local farming properties. The Cemeteries offers burials and interment of ashes within the General Section as well as ashes interment in the Columbarium wall.



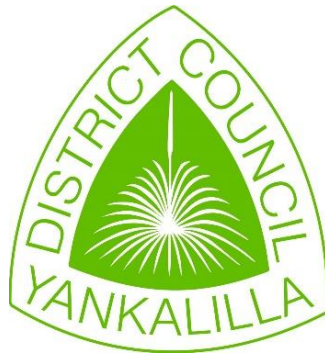
Steps:

Step 1 – Choose a plot

1. Refer to the fees section on page of this pack for more information about various options within our cemeteries.
2. Refer to attached map of visit the Cemetery to assist with your decision.
3. Discuss your preferred site with the Cemeteries administration officer via phone on 8558 0200 – to confirm the plots that are available in your preferred cemetery.
4. We cannot 'Hold' plots, once you have made your decision, go to Step 2

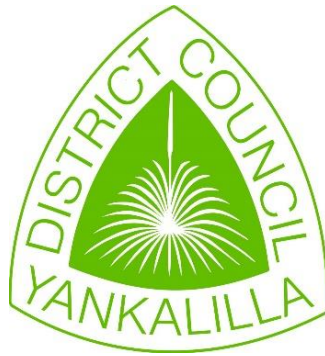
Please note: The Yankalilla and Bullaparinga Cemetery only offer single depth burials. However, they do offer for both burials and ashes interment in the same plot.

Step 2 – Reserve a Plot (Interment Right)

1. Complete an “Application for Interment Right” form
2. Know your rights and responsibilities – Complete the Cemeteries and Crematoria Association of SA (CCASA) Rights and Responsibilities form.
3. Pay the Interment Right Invoice (refer step 3)
 - To reserve a plot in our Cemeteries the Interment Right fee is to be paid and the required documentation is to be completed.
 - The Interment Right is for a term of 99 years
 - Refer to the next page for important information on Interment Rights
 - Any person is eligible to take out an Interment Right
 - There can be a maximum of two registered Interment Right Holder's
 - Refer to the fees pages for the Interment Right fee payable



Interment Rights (Important Information)

In accordance with the Burial and Cremations Act and Regulations, the Interment Right Holder has for the term of the Interment Right:-

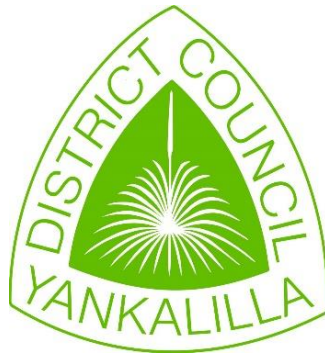
- An exclusive right to request the burial of human remains or interment of human ashes in the site (as per the site specifications)
- An exclusive right to request the erection of an approved memorial at the site.
- The responsibility to maintain the memorial or headstone in a safe and proper condition.

**The Interment Right Holder may only use the site in consistency with the Cemetery Operational Guidelines.

The rights granted to an Interment Right Holder may be exercised upon the death or legal incapacity of the Interment Right Holder by any of the following people in descending order of entitlement:-

1. Executor/s or administrator of estate
2. The spouse or domestic partner
3. The eldest living child
4. The eldest living grandchild or great-grandchild
5. The eldest living brother or sister
6. The eldest living parent
7. The eldest living grandparent
8. The eldest living aunt or uncle
9. The eldest living nephew or niece
10. The eldest living cousin
11. The eldest living blood relative

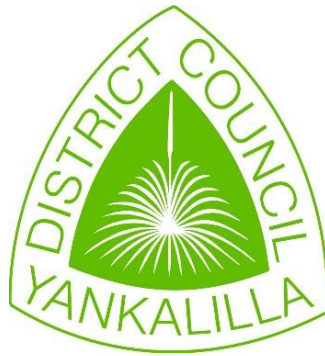
An Interment Right may be cancelled or transferred in accordance with the Cemetery Operating Policy



Step 3 – Pay the Fee (Fees applicable 1 July 2022 to 30 June 2023)

- Upon receipt of your application for Interment Right an invoice will be raised and forwarded to you via email or post depending on your preferred method of contact. Fees are payable once the invoice has been received.
- All other fees are payable at the time of the burial/ashes interment
- The District Council of Yankalilla reviews fees and charges on an annual basis.
- Fees can be paid via BPAY or cash, cheque, credit card at our Front Counter

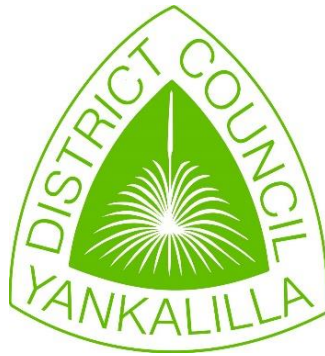
Memorials

All memorial within the cemeteries require a memorial plaque, designed in accordance with Council specifications as detailed in Council's Cemeteries and Community Memorials Policy.

The Monumental mason will require approval from Council for design and wording.

The Cemeteries and Crematoria Association of SA in association with the Monumental Association of SA has a list of licenced Monumental Masons.

Please note that temporary memorials placed by Funeral Directors or loved ones on the plot, may be removed after six months in accordance with Council Policy.



Frequently asked questions

Can I 'hold' a plot that I like until I am ready to pay for it?

We regret that we cannot hold plots. To formally reserve a plot, the Interment Right fee needs to be paid and documentation completed which available on our website or from the Cemeteries Administration officer.

Do I have to be a resident of District Council of Yankalilla before I can take out an Interment Right at your Cemetery?

You don't have to be a resident to take out an Interment Right for a plot within our Cemeteries.

Can we have the ashes interred into the Columbarium Wall first and then organise the plaque at a later date?

We prefer that the placement of ashes occurs at the same time as the installation of the plaque.

Can I scatter my loved one's ashes in the Cemetery?

The scattering of ashes is not allowed within the Cemetery. An Interment Right is to be taken out and the Ashes interred in a plot or the Niche Wall.

Do we organise the coffin and burial through the Council offices?

A licenced Funeral Director is required to complete the burial process. This is required by law. The Funeral Director will contact the Council to finalise the burial arrangements.
