Celebrating the Inaugural Fleurieu AgFest

The District Council of Yankalilla is thrilled to announce the success of the Inaugural AgFest event held on Monday 20 March 2023. The event was designed to showcase the latest ideas and technologies being used in primary production and conservation and land management while highlighting the diversity and abundance of agricultural career pathways available.

The event drew strong attendance, with approximately 260 students and 25 teachers from eight schools across the region, and at least 44 exhibitors and seven food and drink vendors participating.

Visitors enjoyed a range of interactive activities, hands-on workshops, and informative displays on a wide range of topics. Speaker and panel sessions, held throughout the day, covered practicalities of carbon farming, regenerative farming, animal and vet science, climate projections, heavy vehicle regulations and involving students in your farming business.

Students attended sessions in the morning, while primary producers and community members were targeted in the afternoon, followed by pizzas for exhibitors. Visitors also had the opportunity to provide feedback and ideas for future events through a surveymonkey.

The response to AgFest has been overwhelmingly positive, with 100% of respondents indicating that they would like to see the event run again. Ideas for improvement have also been submitted, including the suggestion of having half of the students listening to speakers and panels while the other half engage with the displays, then swapping over. This would give a steadier stream of students to the displays, and the speaker and panel sessions would be shorter too.

CEO'S CORNER

Topics that are required to be dealt confidentially by Council are those that frequently create concern or questions amongst the community. With that in mind I thought I would use this month's CEO Corner to explain when we are required to keep things confidential and how we have adopted an approach to release confidential information at the earliest opportunity.

Legislation requires Council to conduct Council meetings in a place open to the public. Beyond it being a requirement, this openness is a fundamental tenet of our democratic system and I welcome and encourage community attendance at these meetings. However, there will be special circumstances where *Section 90(2) of the Local Government Act 1999* directs Council to 'receive, discuss or consider' information and matters in confidence.

The Local Government Act 1999 lists the kind of information or matters that this will apply to but some examples include; when Council discusses award recipients before the awards have been announced (such as our Citizen of the Year Awards) or when Council discusses commercial

information of a confidential nature where the information could prejudice the commercial interests of the person who supplied the information, or confer a commercial advantage to a third party (such as when tender submissions and pricing are being reviewed).

Since I began at the District Council of Yankalilla, I have worked with an attitude to apply confidentiality only when absolutely necessary but most importantly, I have encouraged our staff to recommend the release of confidential orders at the earliest opportunity.

I recognise that the release of information from confidential discussions, helps the community and any interested party to complete the picture and have a greater understanding of the decisions made, and their context. I want to be able to provide this clarity.

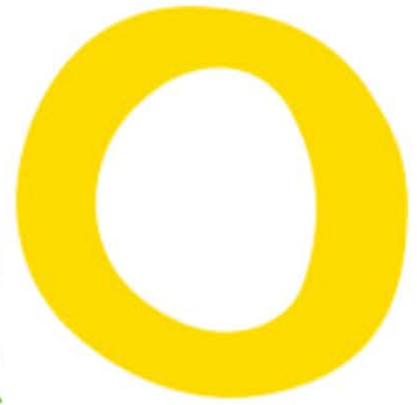

It's important to note that Elected Member Forums are not formal Council Meetings, and therefore no decisions can be made at these meetings. However, they do provide a valuable opportunity for Council Members to gather information and better understand the issues facing our community.

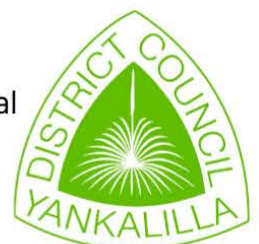

Major Projects Update

We are pleased to provide an update on Council's major projects. We encourage the community to visit our website for a detailed breakdown of the total budget of project expenditure for each project. All information is current as of the time of publishing.



Normanville Surf Life Saving Club and Café/ Kiosk

Blockwork for the ground floor has now been completed with formwork currently being constructed onsite to allow for the second storey concrete slab to be poured. It is expected that the concrete slab will be poured late April (subject to weather). Retaining walls have also been completed, as well as all sewer and underground plumbing in line with the approved plans. The new SA Power Networks transformer has been installed.

Partek will continue the reinstatement of the sand dunes, which is now well underway. This will see the pre-existing material that was excavated from the site be reinstated, which was one of the conditions agreed upon through collaboration with the Coast Protection Board.

Council has released a request for quote to engage a commercial real estate company or agent to advise on (and lead) a suitable process for an 'approach to market' for the Café and Kiosk at the Surf Life Saving Club. Savills Real Estate was appointed to assist Council in seeking market interest for the leasable spaces. The marketing package and plan is being prepared for release through May 2023.



Big 4 Normanville Jetty Holiday Park

We are pleased to announce that the remaining cabins are now complete and certificates of occupancy were issued on Wednesday 5 April. We welcomed guests for the Easter long weekend.

General landscaping works will continue to be delivered and are not critical to enable guests to be welcomed into the newly commissioned cabins.



Normanville Foreshore

Stage 1 Plaza, lawn, and nature play areas are being well utilised and the garden plantings are established and growing into the space.

Boardwalk construction is now complete, and minor defects are being addressed by the contractor. Once the defects are satisfactorily completed, the boardwalk adjacent to the new Surf Life Saving Club will be backfilled with sand that is stockpiled onsite. This boardwalk is designed such that sand will shift over time to cover/uncover the boardwalk due to natural sand movement on the beach.

The boardwalk adjacent to the SLSC will remain closed to the public until Stage 2 of plaza works are completed. The shade/shelter structure is expected to be completed by late April, with ongoing discussion between the builder and design engineers engaged by Council to ensure that the structure is fully compliant.

As previously reported, the final timeframe for car park resurfacing will be negotiated to work around the impacts of the Normanville SLSC & Café/ Kiosk, currently under construction. At this time, it is expected that carpark sealing will occur mid-year with Stage 2 plaza works to commence in late 2023 to align completion with the opening of the new SLSC, Café and Kiosk.

Wheel stops have been received and will be installed in the new Jetty Road carparks in May/June. The remaining wheel stops will be installed once resurfacing of the car park has been undertaken. While the car park is fully compliant, the inclusion of wheel stops will improve the current offering and user experience.

Council's Project Team has identified some minor issues with drainage near the existing shower and is currently working with the designers and civil contractor for a best practice solution to fit within the current budget. Remediation will be undertaken during stage 2 of the plaza works to ensure efficient engagement of subcontractors onsite.

As outlined in previous months, a project review has confirmed that there is currently an estimated overspend of \$491,376 for the Normanville Foreshore Project. This is due to several factors, including the inclusion the original budget estimates of the SLSC Rear Access as part of Stage 2 of the contract with Neo Infrastructure and an inaccurate reflection of the amount of work involved in the original budget estimates for the component of works undertaken by Council staff. The cost breakdown will be split between the current and next financial year, with \$219,231 expected in 22/23 and \$341,306 in 23/24. For more detailed information please visit our website.





Yankalilla Cultural Centre and Library

Library Build and Fit Out

The library building construction was completed and received practical completion prior to its official opening. As per the contract, Council has released one Bank Guarantee. A defects walkover revealed a number of issues that required rectification within a prescribed period. All defects identified as critical have now been completed by the builder, and Council's Project team and Project Superintendent are working with Building Solutions to ensure that the remaining defects are rectified promptly and satisfactorily.

The project remains under a defect liability period until January 2024 with responsibility under the contract for Building Solutions to complete any work to rectify defects identified during this time.

Library Carpark

The construction of stormwater infrastructure within Yankalilla Youth Park has commenced. This upgrade will help manage overland flow issues caused by the newly constructed pump track and will reinstate degraded stormwater swales. Other ongoing works include reinstatement and replacement of irrigation, filling of the area between the new carpark and landscaping, replacing street trees, reinstating several trees removed during the build, and formalising pathways.

The Yankalilla Library build currently has an estimated overspend of \$278,712 due to unexpected variations, including discrepancies with the design, material supply, and other factors. Council has engaged external Project Superintendents to

manage these works, which were not part of the original budget.

Council's project team is currently working with Building Solutions to complete all outstanding works and rectify identified defects. It is expected that all building works will be completed by mid-May, and costs will then be finalised.

Forktree Road Project

The Forktree Road Project is now complete, and the road has been sealed. The project will be removed from the Major Projects Report from May 2023. The project remains under a defect liability period until March 2024 and DML Constructions is responsible for completing any works to rectify defects. There were a number of variations to the project that impacted the budget across the delivery phase, as detailed in the February Major Projects Update.

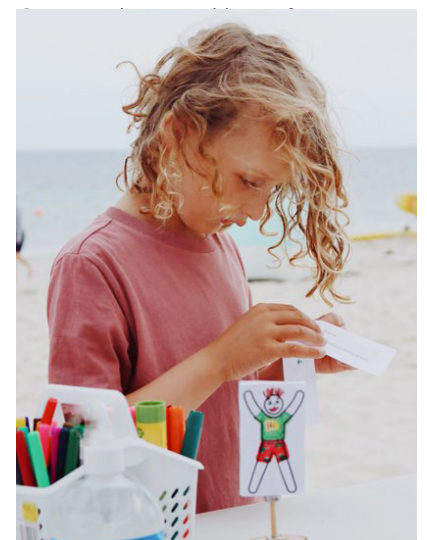

Mayor's Report

The Mayor's report was received. Mayor Darryl Houston discussed the Myponga Loop, the Myponga Bowling Club Presentation Night and his attendance at the opening of Lollies and More@84

Mayor Houston also acknowledged the great success of the Inaugural Ag Fest and congratulated Amy Williams and all the Council staff involved with the planning and organisation of the event.

Reports of Members, Delegates and Working Parties

On behalf of the District Council of Yankalilla Cr Olsson attended the State/Local Government Economic Partnership Forum held at the Adelaide Convention Centre on Friday 24 March 2023.

Cr. Gibbs attended a meeting for the Normanville New Year's Eve Pageant.

Reports of Officers

Myponga Music Festival – Extension of Loan

Council resolved to extend the \$30,000 interest-free loan to VRS Productions, trading as Adelaide Live Events until 30 April 2024 in order to support the Myponga Music Festival which has been unable to occur due to the impacts of COVID-19.

RAA EV Charging Stations Sites and Consultation

The report was received. Council resolved to commence public consultation in relation to the utilisation of Community Land for the purpose of Electric Vehicle Charging with specific reference to the sites of Normanville Village Green and Hansen Street, Myponga.

Draft Asset Management Plans for Transport & Stormwater

The report was received. Council endorsed the Draft Transport and Stormwater, Infrastructure Asset Management Plans to commence public consultation inviting review and feedback.

Draft Annual Business Plan & Budget & Long-Term Financial Plan for Consultation

The report was received. Council endorsed the draft 2023-24 Annual Business Plan & Budget and draft Long-Term Financial Plan for public consultation which will be held over the period Thursday 27 April 2023 to Tuesday 23 May 2023. Council resolved that consultation will be carried out as set out in the Engagement Plan.

Following the consultation period, a revised version of the Annual Business Plan & Budget and Long-Term Financial Plan will be brought to Council's Special Meeting to be scheduled on 27 June 2023.

Dog and Cat Management Fees

The report was received. Council endorsed the Dog and Cat Registration Fees for 2023/24.

Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority 2nd Quarter Budget Review 2022-23

Council resolved to approve the Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority (FRWA) Second Quarter Budget Review for the Financial Year 2022/23. Council received the 22 March 2023 Board meeting summary.

Asset Accounting Policy

The report was received. Council adopted the new Asset Accounting Policy subject to any minor administrative amendments delegated to the Chief Executive Officer.

Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority Business Plan & Budget 2023-24

The report was received. Council approved the Fleurieu Region Waste Authority (FRWA) Draft 2023-24 Budget and Business Plan.

Elected Member Forum Venues

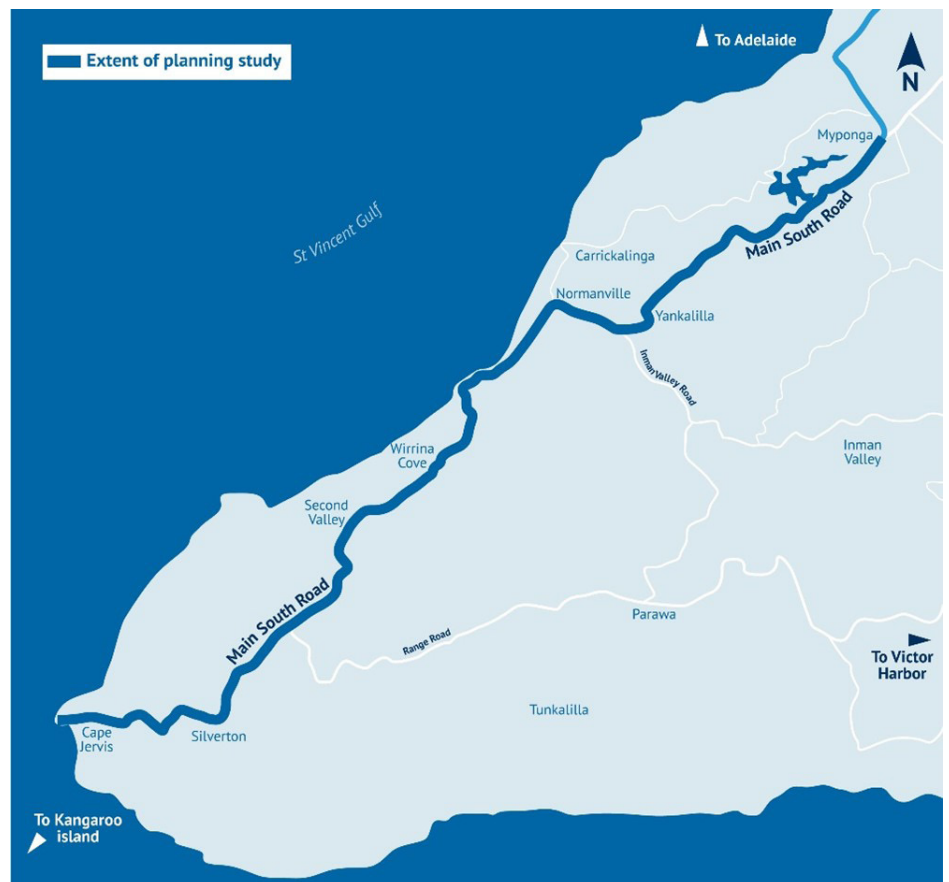
