

## **2021 South Australian Tourism Awards**

The winners and medallists of the 2021 South Australian Tourism Awards were announced at a Gala Dinner on Thursday, 4 November 2021 at the renowned Adelaide Oval.

Our region was represented by three outstanding tourism operators from the region including Naiko Retreat, Smiling Samoyed Brewery and The Backyard Universe.

Smiling Samoyed, the pride of Myponga, was a finalist in the hotly contested Tourism Wineries, Distilleries and Breweries category, which recognises wineries, distilleries and boutique breweries that offer a cellar door experience and create a significant contribution to tourism.

The Backyard Universe was a third-year finalist in the Cultural Tourism category. This category recognises tourism businesses that foster a greater understanding and appreciation of authentic culture, history, heritage and/or the arts.

Naiko Retreat were winners on the night taking out Gold in the Self-Contained Accommodation category and being awarded Bronze in the Ecotourism category with

its contemporary self-contained accommodation overlooking the Backstairs Passage. Naiko Retreat will now represent Fleurieu Peninsula and the State at the National Tourism Awards to be held on the Sunshine Coast, Queensland 4 March 2022. I have been at several community events lately and there seems to be a lot of conjecture around the ownership of the Wirrina Reservoir... some people saying SA Water, others saying the DCY. It was my understanding that at the time of the transfer to SA Water of Wirrina water and sewer on 1/7/19 that ownership of the lake would stay with the Council. An FAQ document by SA Water at the time clearly states DCY would own and maintain the reservoir and I am sure DCY put out something to the same effect. Sally

Response: I can confirm that the Wirrina Reservoir is still owned by District Council of Yankalilla and SA Water have permission to draw water from it. The parcel of land is referenced in our Community Land Management Plan that can be found on our website.

This project assisted member Councils, including the District Council of Yankalilla's staff to be aware, understand and incorporate the design principles in public realm spaces for 'universal access'. Universal access is for all users but especially for those with a disability.

### **Mayor's Corner**

Another Month down as we move closer to the end of the year.

There have been many questions asked about the Myponga Music Festival. After meeting with the committee during October, I am pleased to advise that despite the many COVID related delays they are planning to push ahead with the Festival with a current proposed date of late November 2022.

The results of the External Audit were presented to the October meeting of the Audit Committee. Pleasing results with the external auditor providing feedback that they are happy with Council's financial results and they are of the belief that Council has a good and upfront financial team.

Applications for Council's small community grants have closed, and the assessment committee has met to review the applications received. This year the total value of the applications was below the budgeted allowance. At the November Meeting of Council, these applications were approved, and all applicants will be contacted to advise the outcome.

I attended my first Local Government Association (LGA) Conference and AGM held at the Adelaide Entertainment Centre, where representatives from all Councils throughout the state attend with the same process as a Council Meeting, albeit on a much larger scale.

Several awards were presented during the conference with Southern & Hills Local Government Association (S&H LGA) winning the award for 'Excellence in Public Health'. Presented by Chief Public Health Officer Professor Nicola Spurrier and Minister for Health and Wellbeing Stephen Wade, the award recognised the program developed by S&H LGA identifying community

wellbeing indicators for SA, looking at the health of our environment, the opportunities in our places and the strength of our community.

S&H LGA is a group of Council's consisting of Adelaide Hills, Mt Barker, Alexandrina, Victor Harbor, Yankalilla and Kangaroo Island.

I recently attended the STEAM Expoheld at Victor Harbor Primary School.

Yankalilla Area School were well represented, winning a number of awards in year level categories.

- R Year 2: 1st, 2nd and 3rd Place Winners
- Year 3 4: 1st and 2nd Place Winners
- Year 5 6: 3rd Place Winners

Projects ranged from collapsible bins, edible cutlery and sonar detecting fish traps to reduce by-catch in the fishing industry.

It is amazing to see all the designs and how they could be adapted in to our environment in the future.

Well done to all involved and congratulations to our local winners.

Works have continued around the District with the new Bus Shelter now installed at the Village Green and the completion of the new Pump Track installed at the Yankalilla Youth Park. The Pump Track project was jointly funded by the Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program, Department of Human Services Youth-Led COVID Recovery Grant and Yankalilla Council.

Council are also working on trails and infrastructure in the Second Valley Forest with \$130k of funding towards the first phase of the project. This will include over 13km of multi-use trails for locals and visitors to experience. Another exciting project being undertaken in our district.

## Dogs on Beach During Summer

The weather is warming up and our beaches are getting busier. To make sure everyone can safely enjoy the beach, we have restrictions in place for walking your dogs on the beaches over the summer period.

From 1 December to 28 February dogs are to be on-leash and under effective control from 10am to 6pm on the following beaches:

- Morgan's Beach
- Rapid Bay Beach
- Second Valley Beach East of the causeway/jetty only
- Myponga Beach East of the pedestrian access point
- Lady Bay Beaches From Little Gorge Outlet to South of the Bungala River estuary
- Carrickalinga Beach Between Carrickalinga River and Carrickalinga Head
- Carrickalinga Beach 100 metres either side of the beach access by the public toilets

Outside of these time dogs are permitted off-leash, but always under effective control.

Please remember to follow the local signs which are in place to protect the critically endangered Hooded Plovers.

Council encourages you to familiarise yourself with on/off leash restrictions on the beaches where your furry friend likes to run. Refer to signage or visit Council's website for complete details.



## **Events Trailer** on the Move

You may be seeing the newly completed events trailer around the region which is being used to facilitate equipment for local community groups staging events.

Much to the excitement of our local community groups the events trailer has been 'out and about' most weekends and with the busy summer events calendar coming up, it's going to be in high demand over the busy period.

The popular events trailer comes complete with bunting, orange traffic cones, community event signs, droppers, dropper post driver, dropper caps, T-top bollards and bases, dropper remover, barrier cone bars and several light weight cable quards.

### **Normanville Beach Vehicle Access**

We've been working with the Normanville Boaties Group through their community representative Josh Jenkins, and as per the group's request a gate was installed at the boat access point recently.

We know the gate won't stop people getting bogged, but we do hope it

deters non-4WD vehicles from trying to drive on the beach and removes some of the conflict between pedestrians and vehicles.

A sign has been affixed to the gate explaining the rules for access.







### **Yank Youth go Paintballing**

Fleurieu Coast Youth Advisory Committee (YAC) is made up of young people aged 12-25 years who meet regularly to plan events, determine the risks and barriers involved in them, work through issues and assist in delivery of local events and activities for youth.

Earlier this year YAC identified participating in Paintball to be one of the priorities for experiences they wanted to be involved in. They thought Paintball would give them an opportunity to get to know each other in a different context and develop their communication and ability to work as a team.

We were very pleased to provide them with the opportunity to achieve this outcome on Sunday November 14th when the group travelled to Paintball Sports for this purpose.

YAC provides a great opportunity for young people to be heard, develop skills, and aims to get young people actively involved in their local communities. YAC provides opportunities to young people to participate in youth-related projects, conduct events and influence decisions on issues important to young people. In the process, it gives young people the opportunity for personal growth, to acquire and refine leadership skills and to develop as young people.

### **Hook Line & Thinker Bins on the Fleurieu Peninsula**

During summer the number of people fishing along our coastlines increases. Fishing litter is harmful and does not degrade, lasting up to 600 years in the environment. To protect our unique and fragile environment here on the Fleurieu Peninsula it is important that people fishing off local jetties take care to properly dispose of fishing tackle.

The Fleurieu Environment Centre and District Council of Yankalilla have

joined forces to provide TAngler Bin's for the proper disposal of unwanted fishing tackle. You can now find "Hook, Line and Thinker" bins installed on the Normanville and Second Valley jetties and a third soon to be installed on Rapid Bay Jetty. These bins can be used for the safe disposal of fishing materials such as old line, netting, sinkers, hooks and lures. Volunteers from the Fleurieu Environment Centre will collect the deposits, record the type of waste collected and dispose of it correctly to ensure it doesn't end up in the ocean.

This initiative has also been supported by Ocean Watch Australia, Green Adelaide and the District Council of Yankalilla's What'SUP single use plastic reduction program.

## Which Bin? Green Bin...

With some single use plastic products now banned in South Australia, some of the alternate products available in our community can now be composted in your Green Bin.

Items such as coffee cups, disposable cutlery, plates & even pizza boxes can be added to your green bin to be composted at a commercial compost facility.

To make sure the item you are disposing of is safe for your green bin, check that it is marked with the AS 4736 logo. This logo certifies the material can be composted through your green bin at a commercial compost facility.

If you have a home compost bin, items with the AS 5810 logo are safe to compost at home.
