Five Councillors were re-elected in the 2022 Council Elections and will have four new members join them. 16 nominations were received; six in Field Ward and ten in Light Ward.

Once again, the elections saw strong voter participation in the Yankalilla District, with 2,365 eligible voters casting a vote. At a voting rate of 51%, that puts our community well in front of our neighbouring councils (City of Victor Harbor 46%, and Alexandrina Council 44%), demonstrating how engaged our community is.

Congratulations to all Councillors and the Mayor who will steer our community for the next four years. At its Inaugural meeting on Tuesday 29 November, Council resolved to hold Ordinary Council meetings once a month on the third Tuesday, commencing at 4.00pm in the Council Chambers at 1 Charles Street, Yankalilla

CEO's Corner

I wish to extend my congratulations to our recently elected Councillors who were successful in the Local Government Elections. I look forward to working with you for the full term ahead.

Last week, our team at Council held an Elected Members Induction Day. Members were guided through their roles and responsibilities as Elected Members, given an insight into the world of Local Government and provided an overview of the organisation and the various functions of the District Council of Yankalilla. Elected Members were also given an opportunity to share their aspirations for the next four years as Councillors. A common thread over the day was communication and a desire to see us continually work on this. Communication comes in various forms and an early observation of mine as CEO is that we can absolutely improve the quality and consistency of communications from Council to its ratepayers, residents and visitors. I stand firm on the belief that we need to have a constant awareness of the community we serve and we are sharpening our focus on improvements to our communication methods and standards.

Building from this, I would like to address some concerns that we know are circulating within the community.

Last month I met with the Normanville Sailing Club to listen to their concerns regarding the potential relocation of their Club Shed. A key outcome was that I pledged to pause any relocation until such time as options could be considered in collaboration with the Club, together with our Elected Members. With the elections now concluded, we can schedule some discussions to understand the need for change (if any), options and costs before a decision will be made by the Elected Members. I really enjoyed meeting with the Club and I look forward to working towards an outcome that satisfies the needs of all relevant parties as best it can.

There have also been concerns in the community regarding the ownership of the Normanville Surf Life Saving Club (SLSC) and Café/ Kiosk Building. I would like to reassure all readers that the building now under construction will be a Council owned asset. After a unanimous resolution passed by Elected Members in July 2022, Council signed a Development Agreement with Surf Life Saving SA and the Normanville SLSC. This Agreement allowed Council to assign construction rights to the Normanville SLSC while retaining ownership and great influence over the development outcomes at the site.

The agreement also allows the Normanville SLSC to be a party to the construction contract signed by Partek Constructions. Whilst not a party to the construction contract, Council will continue to be a collaborative partner during the building process and will receive the building at handover in late 2023.

Upon completion of construction there will be space available for three tenants; the Normanville SLSC and two other tenants in the form of a Café and Kiosk (with the option to have one tenant operate both the Café and Kiosk). Council will soon be undertaking an 'approach to market' process to understand the interest and likely income for Café and Kiosk tenancies.

In the meantime, we are retaining a focus on ensuring great user experiences for all visitors to the foreshore precinct during summer, whilst recognising some impact associated with the construction site. We are currently seeking Expressions of Interest from vendors who can offer services such as food trucks, pop-up food stalls, ice-cream vans and coffee vans. Library Update

Exciting things are happening at the Yankalilla Library!

Inside, the final stages of painting and cleaning are underway, to be followed by furniture and shelving installation. Outside, the decking is nearing completion. This will be a terrific addition to the space, allowing library visitors to relax and enjoy their experience outdoors.

Finishing touches such as exterior signage, are also in production and plans are underway to hold an official opening – stay tuned for more details!

The wonderful library staff just keep going above and beyond; busily preparing the collections for relocation, all while continuing to offer library services to the community from the Fleurieu Coast Visitor Centre.

While in our temporary location, the staff have maintained borrowing services and programs (such as the Home Library Service, Tech @ the library, "Sprouts" pre-school program at Rapid Bay Primary School and facilitated the regional Mayors' Short Story Challenge attracting 208 entries





from the 3 schools in the District). They have also continued to look for additional ways to grow and despite the complications of working across two sites and overseeing the transition to the new building, the team were recently awarded two grants and produced the innovative Common Threads Project.

We thank the staff for their dedication and passion for the services they provide to the community.

As this project moves closer to completion, the Yankalilla Library will continue to be temporarily located at the Fleurieu Coast Visitor Centre at 163 Main South Road Yankalilla 5203.

Phat Rager 2.0

When the young people tell us that Phat Rager in Yankalilla was 'pretty good,' what do we do? We put on another one!

Through a partnership with the Myponga Progress Association, the idea of the 'Phat Rager 2.0 Myponga Style' became a reality.

Thanks to the amazing volunteer support from the Myponga Progress Association, it was another great night out of dancing and fun for young people, hosted at the Myponga Hall.

DJ Hazzman provided the entertainment and has a talent for reading the crowd to deliver a great mix of music and get the good times rolling. This set the scene for plenty of dance battles and funky moves! The Myponga Hall was the perfect venue with a fairy light ceiling, comfortable pockets for chilling out and an outdoor area to escape to for a few moments if the excitement on the dance floor was getting too much.

What is a Phat Rager?

A Phat Rager is all about giving young people an opportunity to make social connections, dance and have fun in a space where they can express themselves.

Thanks to the input of the Yankalilla YAC (Youth Advisory Committee) - who developed the concept themselves and came up with name 'Phat Rager' – Council now have a successful 'disco' (but don't call it a disco!) model that can be rolled again in the future.

We have received excellent feedback from the young people, their parents and the community people that helped keep everyone fed and safe. Events like these help our youth have positive experiences with their peers, community leaders and in the place, they live.

Seeds for Snapper

Ever wondered if we can revegetate the ocean? Yes, we can, and we want you to be part of it!

The 'Seeds for Snapper' project is aiming to rehabilitate seagrass beds along our coastline and it's coming to the Fleurieu this summer.

Seagrass meadows are an important nursery ground for snapper, calamari, whiting and blue swimmer crabs. This new project with trial methods to rehabilitate degraded seagrass in the waters surrounding the Fleurieu Peninsula.

Discounted Cat Desexing

The District Council of Yankalilla (supported by a co-funding grant from the Dog and Cat Management Board), the National Desexing Network and a participating vet clinic have joined forces to offer residents in need a subsidised desexing program to help prevent unwanted cats.

District Council of Yankalilla residents on pensions or low income with too many cats or adopting a stray who can't afford to desex will pay just \$50 to desex their cat.

The program is managed by the National Desexing Network. Residents who need support phone the National Desexing Network on 300 368 992 to find out if eligible. If eligible, they will be issued a desexing voucher and can then contact the vet to make an appointment.

These subsidies are available while Council funds last.

Dr Joy Verrinder, Strategic Director of AWLQ's National Desexing Network, urges residents to get their male and female cats desexed between 2 and 4 months of age, as male cats are less likely to fight, roam and spray, and female cats can become pregnant from just 4 months old and can breed continuously after that.

"Yankalilla Veterinary Clinic is this participating vet in this program for District Council of Yankalilla residents and we thank the local veterinary clinic for helping with this community service," said Dr Verrinder.

NDN currently manages year-round Cooperative Desexing Programs free of charge for a growing number of Councils around Australia.

"Ongoing desexing programs have helped achieve zero euthanasia of all healthy and treatable stray and surrendered cats in Gold Coast City, the second largest Council in Australia," Dr Verrinder said.

Dogs on Beach During Summer

The weather is warming up and our beaches are getting busier. To make sure everyone can safely enjoy the beach, we have restrictions in place for walking your dogs on the beaches over the summer period.

From 1 December to 28 February dogs are to be on-leash and under effective control from 10am to 6pm on the following beaches:

- Morgan's Beach
- · Rapid Bay Beach

- Second Valley Beach East of the causeway/jetty only
- Myponga Beach East of the pedestrian access point
- Lady Bay Beaches From Little Gorge Outlet to South of the Bungala River estuary
- Carrickalinga Beach Between Carrickalinga River and Carrickalinga Head
- Carrickalinga Beach 100 metres either side of the beach access by the public toilets

Outside of these time dogs are permitted off-leash, but always under effective control.

Please remember to follow the local signs which are in place to protect the critically endangered Hooded Plovers.

Council encourages you to familiarise yourself with on/off leash restrictions on the beaches where your furry friend likes to run. Refer to signage or visit Council's website for complete details.

Summer Waste Collection Schedule 2022-23

To help our community recycle more, FRWA and council will double the collection of yellow Recycling and green Food Organics Garden Organics bins over the six-week summer holiday period.

The six WEEKLY collections of Recycling bins and Green bins (in eligible townships) over the peak of summer will be on your normal collection day and begin the week of 19th December 2022 and finish the week of 27th January 2023.

Please note that General Waste to Landfill bins (including those with any EC Exceptional Circumstances bins) will continue to be collected fortnightly during this period.

Over the six-week Christmas and New Year holiday period, recycling and food waste increases, therefore it is important to provide more capacity for residents to use their recycling and green bins during this time.


This change will Increase waste disposal capacity by more than 200% over the six-week period, providing an increase in service to residents who generally have more materials to dispose of. For those residents outside of townships that do not have a green bin, there is still an increase in capacity with weekly recycling collections instead of the smaller general waste to landfill bin.

This change follows a two-year investigation into the best way to provide more opportunity for households to recycle more and reduce waste sent to landfill, with the majority of extra waste generated over the Christmas/New year period

being food and packaging. Don't forget, food waste can now go into your green bin, along with your garden waste, and please ensure only compostable bags are used, available at a reduced price at councils and the Fleurieu Regional Waste depot in Yankalilla, Goolwa and Strathalbyn.

The change will provide a significant increase in capacity of waste disposal, even for those with only a weekly recycling collection (see attached graphic showing OLD/NEW capacity).
