After a couple of well received Sunday trials and a few months of organisation by a small group of hardy souls the Myponga Reservoir parkrun finally launched on the 9th of April.

We had over 100 people complete the course on the day from a variety of locations, ages, and fitness abilities.

The event was opened by our parkrun ambassador Kate Corner whose volunteer hours providing experience and knowledge we could not have done without, representatives from the Lions

Club of Yankalilla and SA Water as founding supporters of the event.

We would like to make a special mention to the SA Water Rangers who let us in each week and have provided support for parkrun along the way and to David Loveder who has made the partnership and use of the land an easy process.

The Myponga Reservoir parkrun course is on SA Water Land on the southern side of the Myponga Reservoir Reserve, starting and finishing near the kayak launch car park. It is suggested that you park in the far western area of the carpark.

parkruns are free, weekly community events that take place in parks and open spaces all around the world every Saturday morning at 8am, where participants can walk or run a timed 5-kilometre course.

parkrun provides a positive, welcoming, and inclusive experience where there is no time limit, and no one finishes last. Despite the name you do not need to run at parkrun, everyone is welcome whether you walk, jog, run, volunteer, or spectate and are welcomed as part of the community.

Major Projects Update



Forktree Road Sealing

Forktree Road, between Main South Road and Reservoir Road will be closed to through traffic (local residents exempt) from 7am - 4.30pm Monday the 9th to Friday the 13th of May to allow for final bitumen sealing works to be completed, this was delayed from 2-5 May due to the wet weather. This \$1.9 million project has received over \$1.2 million in grant funding from the Special Local Roads Program, which was staged over two years.

Yankalilla Library

The construction of the new Library is currently in progress and upon completion will be fitted out with the assistance of a \$250,000 Federal Government Grant. Council has also received a \$490,000 grant from the Australian Government's Local Roads and Community Infrastructure Program for the sealing of Thomas Street, including car parking, disability parking, and footpath construction from sustainable Asphalt utilising waste plastics, as well as funding lighting, stormwater treatment, landscaping, and raingardens. In late April the contractor fenced off the carpark for the above works to commence.

Normanville Foreshore Components

The supplier contract has now been awarded for the construction of the Foreshore elements of Carparking, Green Space, Plaza, Beach Access and Nature Play. Planning Consent was granted by the Fleurieu Regional Assessment Panel on 19 April. The contractor has started to fence the site and construction will start in early May. Access to the Beach, Surf Club and Café/Kiosk will remain while constructions works take place

Installation of 23 new Cabins into the Jetty Caravan Park Normanville

Planning consent was granted by the Fleurieu Regional Assessment Panel on 19 April. Underground services work will look to commence in the Caravan Park in early May while the construction of the cabins will also begin to commence offsite. Council remains on schedule to have our first overnight stays in the new Cabins ready for the Christmas/New Year peak season.

Rebuild of the combined Normanville Surf Club and Kiosk/Café

Council has selected the preferred design and Planning Consent was granted by the Fleurieu Regional Assessment Panel on 19 April. The project will now move to the tender and building approval stage and ultimately with the construction phase currently scheduled to commence around October 2022.

Note: In the above table the Council contribution for the Foreshore Elements is not 50% due to Council's contribution to the Normanville Surf Club and Normanville Kiosk being recognised as Foreshore elements by the funding body. External funding for the Surf Club is not grant funded but received from funding commitments. Therefore, funding elements for the Foreshore are dependent on the Surf Club and Kiosk project.

Yankalilla Bowling Club Mural

Another public art project has kicked off, this time at the Yankalilla Bowling Club!

This project is proudly funded in partnership by the District Council of Yankalilla with \$1,000 from the Arts and Creativity Grants Program, \$1,000 from Yankalilla Bowling Club and \$1,000 from the Community Op Shop.

2022 Council Elections – Enrol to Vote

To vote in the 2022 Council election you must be enrolled on either the state electoral or Council voters roll.

State electoral roll

If you are on the State electoral roll at an address within the District Council of Yankalilla area you will automatically receive your voting papers. However, if you have moved or changed your name you will need to update your enrolment. State electoral enrolments forms are available at your local post office or at www.ecsa.sa.gov.au

Council voters roll

If you are not on the State electoral roll within the District Council of Yankalilla area, and you own a rateable property in the area (regardless of whether you live in it) or represent a body corporate/business/group, or are a resident non Australia citizen you will not automatically be included on Council's voters roll. You can apply for inclusion on the Council's voters roll by completing an enrolment form located at www.yankalilla.sa.gov.au

On Sunday 20 March as part of the Festival of Nature, 24 participants had an opportunity to take part in a snorkelling event at the beautiful Second Valley beach.

Split into two groups from Beginners to experienced, our participants were treated with perfect conditions to view the wildlife in our ocean.

The sessions were facilitated by qualified instructors at Reclink SA through a partnership with the District Council of Yankalilla and the Youth program. The event was planned after our youth advisory group (YAC) participants identified snorkelling as something they would like to experience for the first time or develop skills or experience at allowing them to more confidently do so unsupported in the future.

Bushfires & Biodiversity Grant Success

Resilient Hills and Coasts have recently been successful in gaining a \$100,000 grant to look at the best interventions in bushfire risk while balancing biodiversity outcomes.

The project will be delivered across 6 Local Government Areas (LGA's) – Adelaide Hills, Alexandrina, Kangaroo Island, Mount Barker, Victor Harbor and Yankalilla.

This regional scoping and evaluation project will identify the best interventions to apply in communities across these 6 LGA's, to balance bushfire risk and biodiversity outcomes. It will include engagement with landholders and organisations across the region.

More information regarding the local engagement will be communicated as the project progresses.

Twenty Priority Weeds Heading Towards Eradication

Work is well underway to locally eradicate 20 priority weeds that threaten agriculture and biodiversity across the Hills and Fleurieu region.

The 'Towards Eradication: 20 Weeds by 2023' is a two year project, funded by the State Government's Landscape Priority Fund, being delivered by the Hills and Fleurieu Landscape Board with help from private landholders, local councils and state government agencies.

The \$600K project is using a two-pronged approach to get on top of some established and emerging weeds of concern across the region. In many cases the board is working directly with landholders to tackle the priority weeds where they occur on private property. At the same time, the board is working in partnerships with the region's six local councils, National Parks and Wildlife Service South Australia (NPWSSA), SA Water and the Department of Infrastructure and Transport, to eradicate weeds on roadsides and in reserves, including within the Cherry Gardens fire scar.

Susan Ivory, Team Leader Pests and Land, said the project will develop clear eradication plans that will be

carried out in a staged approach to result in long-term local eradication.

"We are working with landholders to monitor and identify where these 20 weeds are currently established and providing detailed eradication plans to help combat their spread. The list of 20 target weeds can be found on our website and if anyone suspects they have any on their property, they should contact us for help with a control strategy.

"We are already seeing positive outcomes across the region, with weeds including Spanish broom, Tufted honey-flower, Sagittaria, Mexican Feather Grass and White weeping broom being identified and recorded in a new weed mapping app, which has also been developed for the project. We can now implement control and monitoring programs with contractors and the landholders," she said.

"We are also working hard with the six councils, and state government departments across the Hills and Fleurieu to remove these weeds from our roadsides, parks and reserves.

"While the 'Towards Eradication' project is very targeted and

deliberate in its delivery, our landscape officers have extensive experience working with private landholders on weed management programs, and are always on-hand for general weed identification and control advice for all pest plant species. Landholders have a responsibility to control declared weeds on their property and best practice weed management starts with the basic principle that effort in the early period of weed invasion provides significant long term efficiencies and value for money," she said.

The Landscape Priorities Fund is funded from landscape levies collected in the Adelaide metropolitan area and redistributed to South Australia's regional landscape boards to enable them to work in partnership with other groups and individuals and invest in environmental projects.

South Coast Hooded Plover Program 21-22 Season Coming to a Close

This year's breeding and fledging season has been relatively successful for the birds, if compared to previous seasons.

The 14 'hoodie' pairs produced 16 fledglings – chick flying after 5 weeks of growth after hatching – from 112 eggs laid in 42 nests on beaches from Goolwa Beach, to the Bluff at Encounter Bay, to the remote beaches on Deep Creek Conservation Park.

Some highlights across the season were hooded plover pairs producing two sets of three chicks which went onto fledge, which is a rare event in the 'hoodie' world.

Particular highlights for the Yankalilla District included;

- Tunkalilla Beach had one of the sets of three chicks and went on to produce another fledgling from another 'hoodie' pair. The resident landholders on this beach helped with the fox problem which arose, and were a great help with reports on hooded plover activities between volunteer visits.
- Balquhiddie Station beaches, which are remote beaches, produced two fledglings. Like at Tunkalilla Beach, landholders and managers here were very interested in the hooded plover program, and tried to help with the fox problems.

Under the auspices of group co-ordinator Wendy White, the City of Victor Harbor, District Council of Yankalilla, and Alexandrina Council,

along with National Park Rangers, were able to support the Hooded Plover Program when required.

If becoming a volunteer for the South Coast Friends of the Hooded Plovers is something anyone is interested in, they can contact co-ordinator Wendy White by calling her on 0413 918 085.

The hooded plover is a beach nesting bird and is listed as a vulnerable species, so this birdlife Australia program hopes to lift the number of Hooded Plovers on SA beaches.

The hooded plover project is jointly coordinated by Green Adelaide and Birdlife Australia, with support from local councils, and is funded by Green Adelaide and the Hills and Fleurieu Landscape Board, through funding from the Australian Government's National Landcare Program.

Mayor's Report

The Mayor's report was noted.

Reports of Members, Delegates and Working Parties

Cr. Rowlands provided a report on his attendance at the Yankalilla Volunteer Ambulance Service 50th Birthday Celebrations which was included in the minutes.

Cr. Olsson provided a verbal report to advise of an ANZAC Day service being held at Second Valley.

Deputations

Ms Val Gubbin addressed Council re Agenda Item 14.7 – Opportunity to Purchase Uniting Church Cemeteries, Normanville and Torrens Vale.

Mr Fraser Farrell addressed Council re Agenda Item 14.6 – Wirrina Community Land Management Plan (55A Seaview Avenue) and the Backyard Universe.

Mr Jim Liapis requested a deputation regarding a presentation of an Alternative 2 Building Solution for the redevelopment of the Surf Life Saving Club and Kiosk/Café.

The Mayor declined the request for the following reason: Given the April agenda is large and requires in-depth discussion on matters within the agenda, there would be limited time (5 minutes) for a presentation of an alternate option for the surf club/Kiosk rebuild. I don't believe a 5 minute.

Deputation will allow a fair and in-depth presentation to Elected Members. I recommend that this is brought to the next Elected Members Forum for presentation and discussion.

Mobile Coverage and Telecommunications Infrastructure Improvement – Second Valley and Rapid Bay

Council resolved that the Chief Executive or delegate investigate and implement requirements of the recently announced Federal Government \$1.3B budget allocation for regional telecommunication infrastructure in an effort to secure an allocation of funding for improved mobile coverage at Second Valley, Rapid Bay and Sellicks Hill.

Rescission Motion – Combined Rebuild of Normanville Surf Lifesaving and Kiosk/Café

The motion to cease all work pertaining towards a combined rebuild design for the Normanville Surf Club and Kiosk/Café and, instead investigate a 2 building solution which is currently circulating in the community was lost.

Draft 2022/23 Annual Business Plan and Budget and Long-Term Financial Plan for Consultation
