Happy 2017 to you all. After wrapping up 2016 in our usual spectacular style, it's now time to look forward to what the New Year holds for our wonderful district.

We had a fantastic New Year's Eve pageant and I would like to thank all those in the community who brought our streets to life and helped celebrate the New Year with a bang. Many thanks to Council for allocating funds to contribute to this much-loved community event.

Australia Day is fast approaching and the celebrations and ceremony from 9am on January 26 at Bungala Park will be incredibly special. This year's theme is 'recognising our volunteers'. We encourage everyone in the district to attend.

A few highlights on the calendar include Festival Fleurieu in April and History Month in May.

Our last Council meeting for the year also wrapped up a busy period. Of note was the heritage policy, and the new controls and by-laws for the beaches and reserves which outline issues including the prescribed times and areas for dogs to be on and off leash.

While considering the controls and by-laws, elected members showed great concern towards the beachgoers and dog owners, while being sympathetic towards the environment (particularly Hooded Plovers) and the feedback from the community. I believe the outcome will be acceptable to all and I hope all beach-users enjoy the space, beauty and freedom together. The Heritage Policy report was also a topic of debate and Council decided it required further workshop discussion. This issue was adjourned but we also supported a recommendation to write to the Ministers for Planning and Heritage to express support for the City of Adelaide Position Paper on Heritage Reform November 2016.

# SEWERAGE

Council has recently upgraded three of the existing 13 pump stations and will upgrade the remainder by the end of March 2017. This upgrade will give Council remote real-time monitoring and a state-of-the-art control system. This will provide energy savings by optimising pump control outputs throughout the district with better safety control.

### HOT HOT HOT As we reach the m residents and visit impacts of extrem

As we reach the middle of Summer we urge all residents and visitors to take measures to reduce the impacts of extreme heat.

**Check On Those At Risk** Visit at-risk individuals such as the sick and elderly and keep an eye on children.

**Dress For Summer** Wear lightweight, light coloured clothing to reflect heat and sunlight and help your body maintain a normal temperature.

Minimise Sun Exposure Keep out of the sun as much as possible. If you must be in the sun, wear a shirt, hat, sunglasses and sunscreen.

**Prepare Your Home** Prepare your home early by servicing air conditioning units before you need them.



**Remember Your Pets** Pets can be particularly vulnerable to the heat so make sure they have shade and plenty of water.

Make Use Of Air Conditioning Make use of public facilities such as shopping centres, art galleries, cinemas, the library or other air-conditioned buildings.

### HISTORY

Ever wondered where 'Dog Trap' near Delamere got its name from?

It may sound somewhat self-explanatory when one stops to think about it. The name comes from early graziers who used carefully crafted traps to catch wild dogs and protect their flocks.

Dingoes were a significant problem within the district for farmers who used many different methods to save their animals from loss and injury.

Flocks were yarded at night and shepherds tied their dogs around the yard to ward off dingoes, but the deterrents didn't stop there.

Graziers also set dog traps which looked like small log huts with bait placed inside, sneakily allowing the dingo to squeeze far enough in, but not get out.

So infamous were these traps that the name stuck. For more information like this – please stop by the Visitor Information Centre in Yankalilla.

### FREE DUMP DAY – 27 JANUARY 2017

Residents, tenants and holiday makers are invited to take advantage of a free 'Dump Day' at the Yankalilla Waste and Recycling Depot in late January.

The generous initiative, funded by Council, will help enable those in the district to clean-up at the end of the holiday season.

Council will issue a Dump Pass to eligible community members and only customers producing the pass on the day will be permitted

to use the facility free of charge, no more than 5x8 trailer. One 'Dump Pass' per property can be collected from the Council office prior to the event.

Domestic waste, hard waste, green waste and recyclables will be accepted. Commercial waste, e-waste, hazardous waste, mattresses or tyres will be prohibited.

The dump will be open 9am to 3pm on Friday January 27.



### COUNCIL SUPPORTING LIBRARIANS OF THE FUTURE

Local history will be the primary focus of Masters work experience student, Anna Seidl, who will spend more than a month with the Yankalilla Library.

### REPRESENTATION REVIEW SECOND ROUND OF PUBLIC CONSULTATION

Council is undertaking a review of elector representation, examining different models relating to the composition and structure of Council. The second round of public consultation is now being undertaken for a period of 6 weeks commencing Thursday 12 January 2017.

The first round of feedback has been considered by Council in proposing to retain the current approach to the number and election of Councillors, Chairperson (called Mayor) and the retention of Wards.

A Public meeting will be held on Tuesday 21 March 2017 and anyone who has lodged a submission in relation to the Representation Review Report will be invited to attend and given an opportunity to make a verbal submission to Council.
