Wilampa Trail

Two New Trails Open in Second Valley Forest

The Wilampa Trail & Jones Journey multiuse trails were officially opened on the 9th December 2021 by Forestry SA and The District Council of Yankalilla.

Whether you are a walker, bike rider, horse rider or pooch walker you are going to love both of these 7km trails.

The Trails are located in the Second Valley Forest Reserve and can be accessed from Bedlam Flat Road near the corner of Range Road, Delamere.

Wilampa Trail

Suitable for walkers, cyclists and horse riders, this multi-use loop trail recognises traditional owners, the Kaurna people. The name 'Wilampa' comes from Kaurna language meaning 'black cockatoo with yellow or white feathers', in recognition of the endangered Yellow Tailed Black Cockatoo known to inhabit the forest and feed on the seeds of pinecones. Starting at gate BF12 off Bedlam Flat Road, the trail traverses a network of fire tracks through pine plantation and a mixture of hardwood species. Sections of the trail follow the creek line and passes the Second Valley Forest depot and historic sheep yards.

Distance: 7 km return.

Time: allow 2 hours to walk or 1 hour to ride the whole trail.

Jones Journey

Suitable for walkers, cyclists and horse riders, this multi-use loop trail is named after the Jones family, who have a long and illustrious association with the forestry department, with over four generations of service predominately in Second Valley Forest. Starting at gate JO2 off Bedlam Flat Road, the trail traverses a network of fire tracks through pine plantation. Keep an eye out for soaring Wedge Tailed Eagles along the way. The trail includes good views of the surrounding farmland and Fleurieu coast.

Distance: 7 km return.

Time: allow 2 hours to walk or 1 hour to ride the whole trail.

These two new trails make up the first formalised trail network within the Second Valley Forest, providing new recreational opportunities and increased access to the forest.

The new visitor carpark has been established off Bedlam Flat Road thanks to our depot team, providing parking and a turnaround point for horse floats.

For more information on the history of forestry and the timber industry, stop in at the Fleurieu Coast Visitor Centre - home of the Yankalilla & Districts Historical Museum, and view the Jones Collection at 163 Main South Road Yankalilla.

Another busy month with meetings and events to round out the year.

Council adopted the 2020/2021 Annual Report at the November meeting, listing our achievements over the past year and our financial status moving forward.

I had the pleasure of welcoming visitors and officially opening the Yankalilla Classic Motor Show hosted by the Yankalilla and Districts Lions Club. While they were expecting some 120 cars to enter, these numbers were exceeded with over 200 cars entering and well over 1000 people attending. They do an amazing job and without them we would not be able to offer the current levels of service offered.

The District Council of Yankalilla have many volunteers from various groups, including Council services throughout the district. I would like to thank all our volunteers for the many services they offer in our area.

I was asked to attend the opening of the new Second Valley walking trails, to open the Wilampa trail and it was an honour to stand along aside Merv Jones to open the Jones Journey. The Jones Family have had a long history of working in our local Forests.

A drive to the yet unopened new Heysen trail camp site at Parawa was impressive with new landscaping, shelters and campsites. One to keep an eye on once opened.

Thank you to our Volunteers

On Wednesday 8th December the District Council of Yankalilla, represented by Mayor Simon Rothwell, Deputy Mayor Leon Zarins and Chief Executive Nigel Morris, hosted the Volunteer Team at Lady Bay Hotel for the Annual Christmas Lunch and Service Award presentations.

Community Transport:

The 38 strong CHSP volunteer team assisted 401 Active clients and in the last financial year they took 1,950 residents to appointments, totalling 4,419 service deliveries, covering 160,888 kms, which is equal to 11 trips around Australia!

This is up 21% on 2020 service deliveries and included destinations such as Victor Harbor (624 trips), Flinders Medical Centre (272), Adelaide (145), Noarlunga/Morphett Vale (139) and 386 local drives.

A 5th Community Transport vehicle has been added to the fleet to help with the increase in demand.

Fleurieu Coast Visitor Centre:

The Fleurieu Coast Visitor Centre's 25 Volunteers welcomed 8,412 guests through its doors in 2020/2021 and responded to 6,997 phone and social media enquiries.

During Festival Fleurieu the FCVC was instrumental in managing the event bookings for 24 events. In addition, the Visitor Centre was host to numerous events and became an information hub for all visitors to the region who wanted to experience Festival Fleurieu.

Yankalilla Library:

During the 2020/2021 financial year, a total of 9 volunteers supported the Yankalilla Library service with 547 hours of work despite our Covid-19 challenges.

During the year the Yankalilla Library had 31,300 visitors; lent 26,300 items; delivered 278 programs which were attended by more than 1200 people.

Community Nursery End of Year Wrap Up

Over the last year the nursery expanded its footprint within the District Council of Yankalilla's Works Depot and improvements in facilities commenced with help from Council staff who constructed a sheltered area, plumbed and powered the site. Upgrade works continue with an extension to the working area shelter being undertaken due to an increase in regular volunteers.

Over 40,000 local native plants have been propagated and grown by the volunteers this year with ongoing support, direction and planning by Corey Jackson, Coastal Conservation Officer supported by Green Adelaide and hosted by the District Council of Yankalilla. Grant funding and volunteer support from Conservation Volunteers Australia was completed with aims achieved of building up local volunteer numbers and providing an opportunity for people to be active in natural area restoration activities.

In developing this facility to its current capacity, we acknowledge the great support that we have been able to secure from the following organisations:

- District Council of Yankalilla providing initial funding and 'in-kind' support for use of land, power, water and staff who worked on improvements to the Nursery site.
- Green Adelaide Landscape Board

 ongoing Coastal Conservation
 Officer support and funding for
 the community nursery.

- SA Health, Office for Ageing Well, Age Friendly SA grant - Greening the Fleurieu Coast and Green Gym projects.
- Coast Protection Board Coastal Communities grant 2020/21 funding the Gazania Free Gardens Plant Swap program.
- One Tree Planted supporting the Gazania Free Gardens Program and funding the new greenhouse.
- Foundation for National Parks

 providing funding for all the new nursery upgrades including a portable toilet and nursery/ planting trailer.

In the 2021 we have expanded our volunteer database to 50 people and have regular volunteer attendances of between 12 and 20 people on the first and third Monday of each month with some additional working bees. This has resulted in a conservative estimate of 800 to 900 volunteer hours this year, which translates to approximately \$33,000 to \$38,000 of volunteer value.

A celebration was held at the Fleurieu Coast Community Nursery on Monday the 6th of December during the last working bee for the year. Mayor Simon Rothwell and Councillor Glen Rowlands attended the event and thanked the volunteers for their contribution to council and community projects.

Council also resolved to grant the Chief Executive leave over the festive period.

Consent to Conversion from Limited Title to Ordinary Title – Main South Road near Wattle Flat Road
