RATE REVIEW

Council has undertaken to conduct a full rate review in response to ratepayer's concerns. Council engaged John Comrie, JAC Comrie Pty Ltd, to workshop with Elected Members the basis of rating for Council. The proposed method of rating is now available for your comment and written submissions. Summary leaflet and Rate Review reports can be viewed on Council's website or copies available at the Council Office.

Public Forums will be held at Yankalilla, Myponga and Cape Jervis in January, dates will be published on the website. Consultation commences Monday 14 December 2015, closing Friday 29 January 2016.

FRWA KERBSIDE COLLECTION

In May/June 2012, the Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority (FRWA) undertook a regional kerbside bin audit of selected properties within the areas of Alexandrina Council, Kangaroo Island Council, City of Victor Harbor and District Council of Yankalilla. The audit found that 55% of the general waste stream consisted of potentially recyclable materials (28% recyclables and 27% food/green waste).

On the basis of this, FRWA recognised the potential to encourage diversion of waste from landfill by altering the bin collection schedule. FRWA's constituent councils supported a pilot/trial of fortnightly collections within a small selected area comprising of 630 dwellings. The project ran for four months allowing the effects of fortnightly collections to be evaluated both during times when few holiday makers are present, through to the peak summer holiday season.

A report (FRWA fortnightly kerbside collection Implementation Program & Operating Budget) is available for review by the community on the council's website. In order for councils to make an informed decision regarding the future of waste collections across the mainland FRWA region, it is necessary to compare the costs and benefits of fortnightly collections with the costs and benefits of other possible collection schedules.

Council is seeking comment from the community in relation to this proposal and will be conducting consultation in relation to the FRWA proposal for fortnightly kerbside waste collection. Council encourage residents to comment by reviewing the documentation and completing the online survey. Alternatively you can attend a public meeting on Thursday 17 December at 4.30pm. Consultation period closes 31 December 2015.

CODE OF PRACTICE

Council are undertaking Public Consultation on its reviewed Code of Practice – Formal Proceedings of Council and Committee Meetings. Consultation period closes 11 December 2015.

YANKALILLA CEMETERY

Consultation continues on the conservation and protection of the historically significant cemetery. Concept plan and survey available online.

ROADWORKS - RAPID BAY ROAD

Council has received funding under the Roads to Recovery / Special Local Roads Program to undertake improvements along Rapid Bay Road.

The work will include the following:

- Scraping of existing cut batters to remove loose rock that fall onto the road
- Alteration of deep drainage culverts located adjacent to the road
- Shoulder reconstruction
- Repair of failed pavement sections
- Road resealing, including changes to the intersection of Lord Road and Rapid Bay Road
- Guard rail installation at high risk locations
- New Road signage and line marking

Initial batter work will be commencing in early December, and there may be minor delays if using the road during this period. Major on-site work will cease during the summer school holiday period.
