### Our Nature's Best plan recognised among the best in Australia

We are proud to have been recognised in the national 2020 International Association for Public Participation (IAP2) Australasia Core Values Awards as First Highly Commended for the category of 'Planning Project Award' for our project 'Nature's Best, Let's Plan the Rest.'

We were excited to be the only finalist from both a regional area and from South Australia. We were in good company with other finalists being announced as the City of South Perth, City of Sydney and the Department of Transport (Victoria), just to name a few. The City of Sydney was the winner of our category and went on to win the overall award for which we congratulate them and aspire to our Council achieving in coming years.

This is our first submission and we were thrilled to be recognised first as a finalist then runner up nationally for using our extensive, innovative tools and techniques to successfully and actively engage over ten percent of

our diverse and dispersed community in strategic planning for the future, within a modest budget.

Mayor Rowlands attributes our success to strong community interest and involvement through Council adopting an outreach approach. The process involved intensive hands-on work from everyone from the Mayor and Council Chief Executive, Nigel Morris who led and owned the process, combined with integrated use of traditional, face-to-face, and online tools to achieve robust outcomes with and for our great community.

The now nationally recognised Strategic Plan sets out our ten-year vision and four-year focus based on what we heard from you in the community. The plan was endorsed by Council at the November meeting and will be used to target grant funding and populate our Annual Business Plan and Budget, which we would look forward to sharing with you in coming months.

### Council's Disability Access and Inclusion Plan

Development of Council's Disability Access and Inclusion Plan (DAIP) has been a key project over the last 18 months.

It has been developed to integrate with the District Council of Yankalilla Strategic Plan 2020-2024, Council's Age Friendly Plan and the Regional Public Health Plan.

The development of Council's DAIP took place between November 2019 and February 2020. All community consultation activities, analysis of community feedback and draft action planning occurred prior to the COVID-19 pandemic and related restrictions.

There were 52 people from across all areas of Council administration that participated in interactive workshops and over 400 people participated in a Speak Out community event organised to engage the whole community on strategic planning for the district.

The Access and Inclusion Forum was attended by 15 people, including people living with disability, carers and service providers.

The opportunity was also provided for written submissions, of which 27 were received by Council.

The Disability Access and Inclusion Plan was endorsed by Council in October 2020. You can find a full copy of our DAIP on Council's website.

## CEO's Corner

### Ask the CEO (Nigel Morris)

**Q. When will the work that was started long ago to seal all of Forktree Road be recommended?**  
- Ian

The section of Forktree Road from Reservoir Road to Main South Road has many large native trees along its corridor and it contains a SA Water trunk water main.

Over the past two years, Council Officers and the road designers from HDS Australia have been assessing and designing a new sealed road that considers the following:

- Meets relevant "fit for purpose" safety requirements for the anticipated traffic
- Minimises the loss of existing native vegetation
- Minimises the impact on the existing SA Water Infrastructure
- Minimises land acquisitions from adjoining land owners

Council has been liaising with SA Water and undertaking Native Vegetation assessments during this period.

The design work was completed, and the project was submitted for support funding under the Special Local Roads Funding program.

Council was successful in obtaining 2/3 funding for the commencement of a stage 1 component of the works in 2020/2021, with the completion of the project to occur in the 2021/2022 financial year.

**Q: Is it a fact that federal law compels councils to grant exemptions from property rates for religious organisations? Can you estimate how much extra revenue**

**our council would receive annually if this exemption was scrapped? As, according to the latest census, one in three Australians says they have no religion, would the council consider lobbying the federal government for the exemption to be scrapped, or at least for each council to be allowed to decide whether to allow the exemption?**

The South Australian Local Government Act 1999 section 162 states that the rates on land containing a church or other building used for public worship (and any grounds), or land solely used for religious purposes, will be rebated at 100 percent.

We ran the sums and based on the current capital values and the rate in the dollar (0.517247 differential rate-other), the additional revenue that Council would have raised if we were to rate those exempt properties would have been approximately \$19,409.00.

The decision to lobby the State Government on the exemption would be made by Elected Members. During my past five years at Council we have been lobbying for a change on the formula for distribution of Federal Assistance Grants that is currently based on the census population of the area, given that nearly half our properties are not the prime residence for our ratepayers and therefore not counted in the census, we feel our allocation of funds is at a disadvantage. The focus on this advocacy has the greater opportunity for financial reward.

**Q How much did the meeting and the preparation for the Yankalilla Districts Ratepayers Association (YDRA) cost? - Cheryl**

Council held a public meeting, 10 November 2020 to present an overview of the Budget and Long

Term Financial Plan and answer a series of questions. To prepare for the presentation and questions took approximately 8 hours and the presentation had three staff members in attendance for approximately 2 hours. All up it cost 14 hours of staff time.

**Q Why did Administration decide to hold the meeting instead of answering YDRA by email? – Cheryl**

Earlier in the year the Secretary of YDRA and I agreed that after spending hours on e-mails on another issue, that having a series of e-mails going back and forth was a waste of time for both parties and it was much better to have a face-to-face or telephone conversation.

With the Budget and Long Term Financial Plan being such a complex issue, Council felt this would be an ideal opportunity to do another face-to-face instead of an e-mail response. By performing a presentation, we could illustrate a greater overall picture of our finances instead of just simply answering the questions.

By doing the presentation in person also ensured that the audience were able to understand each point before moving on and could instantly seek clarification if required. Following the presentation, we were able to go through each of the 20 plus questions and interact on any point if required.

We also were able to answer any other questions in addition to the original ones provided to those that physically attended or participated remotely by Zoom.

Council is there for the community and we welcome the opportunity to meet with Community Groups.

## Mayor's Corner

We all have been watching our neighbouring states go through another wave of COVID-19 outbreaks. Just as we see those borders opening up South Australia had an outbreak, how fortunate are we to have the leadership to manage the situation and keep us safe, unlike some countries around the world.

The advice we are given is the realism that COVID-19 will continue to disrupt our lives when we least expect it, so do not get too complacent in the clear periods as these outbreaks will continue from time to time.

## Council's GM Crop Free Request Denied by the Minister

As was required by the legislation, Council undertook a consultation process between 27 July and 21 August 2020 to understand the position of its community in order to determine whether a submission would be made to apply to be a GM crop free area.

Council received feedback from our community with 87% of community responses wanting to remain GM free and 71% responses from Primary Producers wanting to remain GM free.

The District Council of Yankalilla voted unanimously at the Council meeting held 15 September 2020 to write to the Minister for Primary Industries and Regional Development to request for our district to remain GM crop free.

We remain committed to continuing our essential services but the way we deliver these may look a little different for now.

Earlier this month I had been busy connecting with State Ministers and Local Government officials. The highlight of my month was attending the Ngarrindjeri Aboriginal Corporation (NAC) day where they presented their vision and ability to connect with the councils who have their Native Title land. I came away from the day inspired of what can happen with leadership and I encourage the indigenous groups in our Council region to use the NAC approach and template. Many cultural areas in this region could be shared and preserved.

Council has a lot happening at the moment and we continue to ask you to comment on various projects and initiatives. I hope it's not too overwhelming, but as part of our communication we need to know your thoughts.

Thank you for playing your role in keeping our community safe. We may be physically distanced, but as a community, have never been more united.

On 2 November the Minister for Primary Industries and Regional Development David Basham said, "outside of Kangaroo Island, there was no substantial evidence to justify any council area remaining GM-free". "The Government's GM Crop Advisory Committee assessed the 11 applications and deemed there wasn't sufficient evidence to recommend designation as an area where no GM food crops can be grown".

Mayor Rowlands said "Council should respect the decision of the Minister for Primary Industries and Regional Development therefore, I ask that any correspondence regarding the decision be directed to the Office of Hon David Basham MP, GPO Box 1671 Adelaide SA 5001".



## Dogs on Beaches During Summer

The weather is warming up and our beaches are getting busier. To make sure everyone can safely enjoy the beach, we have restrictions in place for walking your dogs on the beaches over the summer period.

From 1 December to 28 February dogs are to be on-leash and under effective control from 10am to 6pm on the following beaches:

- Morgan's Beach
- Rapid Bay Beach
- Second Valley Beach – East of the causeway/jetty only
- Myponga Beach - East of the pedestrian access point
- Lady Bay Beaches – From Little Gorge Outlet to South of the Bungala River estuary
- Carrickalinga Beach - Between Carrickalinga River and Carrickalinga Head
- Carrickalinga Beach - 100 metres either side of the beach access by the public toilets

Outside of these time dogs are permitted off-leash, but always under effective control.

Please remember to follow the local signs which are in place to protect the critically endangered Hooded Plovers.

# Council Decisions

## Motion on Notice

Normanville Foreshore Recognition of Families that Gifted Valuable Parcels of Land – Cr. Verwey. This motion was Lost, therefore no further action will be taken.

## Chief Executive Report

The report was received with the granting of Annual Leave for the Chief Executive over the Christmas/New Year period and the appointment of the Chief Operating Officer as Acting Chief Executive during this time.

Council also made the decision to not release from confidence the Fleurieu Futures Reports as the Mayors and Chief Executives from the three Councils could not reach consensus on their release.

## Council Committee Minutes

The minutes of the recent Fleurieu Regional Assessment Panel and the Audit Committee meetings were received.

## Council's Strategic Plan – 2030 Vision and Four Year Focus Plan

Closing off the 'Nature's Best – Let's Plan the Rest', Council's biggest community consultation ever, Council has adopted the final Strategic Plan. The community feedback was greatly appreciated and used to amend the final plan.

## Council's Economic Development Strategy – Prosperous by Nature

After receiving results from the recent community consultation, Council adopted its Economic Development Plan providing a five-year planning framework to support the vibrancy, diversity and sustainability of the communities of the Yankalilla District, to 2025 and beyond.

## Management of the Rapid Bay Campground

A report was presented outlining options for the future management

and opportunities for the Rapid Bay campground. It was decided that the Chief Executive present additional information and detailed business cases on continuing the existing campground on parcel of land Crown Record 5226/62 and providing a more upmarket or RV zones at the other end of the parcel of land, to the February 2020 Elected Member Forum.

## Allocation of Community Grants 2020/2021

The Community Grants were allocated and several Elected Members donated their annual Elected Member allowance increase towards their choice of applicant to increase the grant amount. *Please refer to the article on Community Funding to see the allocations.*

## Community Land Management Plan, Normanville Foreshore

Council endorsed the updated Community Land Management Plan to reflect Council's ownership of Lot 430 (previously owned by the Crown) and apply current trust restrictions of use as a reserve for café and surf life saving club purposes over the whole of Lot 100 and portions of Lot 430, both located at Normanville foreshore.

## Normanville Beach Café, Request for Lease for Shipping Container

Council has agreed to a lease for Aldelphies Pty Ltd to install a shipping container over portions of land Lot 100 and Lot 430, Normanville Foreshore. This lease will be granted on a month-to-month basis at a fixed fee of \$600 per month.

The container will be used as an extension to the current Café and Kiosk space as shown in the image.



## Normanville Foreshore Land Transfers 1945 and 1955 – Legal Advice

Following discussions regarding the gifting of land at the Normanville foreshore, Council sought legal

advice in relation to Allotment 120 transferred in 1945 and Allotment 122 transferred in 1955.

The legal advice provided reads:

*"That there is no evidence that either of the two areas of land are subject to any trust binding on Council. Indeed, there is evidence that directly contradicts such a position being the case. Council may use and deal with either area of land in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Act 1999 applicable to council land classified as community land".*

## Backhouse Road, Delamere – Road Closure

Consultation on the proposed road closure of Backhouse Road was received and Council determined to continue the road closure process by issuing a new Certificate of Title to the District Council of Yankalilla for portion of the road and the remaining sections of road to be merged with adjoining Certificate of Titles. Easements will be granted for right of way on foot for access to the Heysen Trail and free and unrestricted rights of way for access to private properties.

## Process Required to Change Zoning in Myponga

Through engagement with the Myponga community during the recent 'Nature's Best – Let's Plan the Rest', the community voiced the need for tourism growth in the district.

Council endorsed a project plan for zoning changes in the township of Myponga to facilitate greater tourist accommodation and commercial activity.

## Yankalilla and Normanville Streetscape Master Plan

In 2010 Council commenced the process to implement a streetscape plan for the townships of Yankalilla and Normanville. Following the completion of the district's Structure Plan, Council has been given the opportunity to finalise this plan that stretches along Main South Road from Arthur Street at the eastern end of Yankalilla to Jetty Road in Normanville.

The Plan documents the elements of the history of the area which have

contributed to character, identifies works undertaken in response to the Plan, identifies outstanding issues and makes recommendations, and sets priorities, for future works.

### Annual Report and Financial Reports for 2019/2020

Council's 2019/2020 Annual Report, which includes the Full Year Financials, was adopted outlining Council's business and highlights of the 2019/2020 financial year.

### First Quarter Budget Review – 2020/2021

Council's Audit Committee recommended that Council adopt the first quarter budget review as Council's current budget. The changes are a materially positive gain for Council due to the significant grant funding that has been won. This has moved the Total Comprehensive Income from a deficit of \$50,096 to a surplus of \$701,270 which in turn will reduce the level of financial liabilities.

The adjustments in the First Quarter Budget Review forecasts an end of financial year Operating Deficit of \$195,893 and a Total Comprehensive Income surplus of \$701,270.

### Treasury Management Report

Council received the Treasury Management Report outlining Council's loan liabilities and investments as of 30 September 2020.

### COVID-19 Rates Relief and Business Support

To assist local businesses with the downturn from COVID-19, Council waived 50% of three months of lease payments for Adelphies Pty

Ltd on their lease on Lot 100 Jetty Road Normanville for a total value of \$4,941.19 and approved discretionary rate rebates for Pinarello Blues P/L \$5,543.50 and Links Lady Bay P/L \$2,875.41.

As part of the future upgrade for the Yankalilla Library the current shade structure at the Centre will not be required in the new layout. Council will investigate the option of the moving the shade structure from the Centre to the Yankalilla Pocket Park to enable outdoor seating for local Yankalilla Business Patrons and a report outlining findings and costs will be presented to the December 2020 meeting of Council.

Council granted \$2,200 to the Twilight Market project so they can offer discounted amusement rides to children.

### Credit Card Facility – Increase in Credit Limit to \$50,000

Council authorised the Chief Executive the ability to increase the business credit card facility with ANZ to \$50,000. Best practice for procurement of small items is the use of credit cards, therefore staff are utilising their cards more frequently and Council may need to increase limits of current users and this also allows additional cards to be provided where required.

### Regional Subsidiaries and other Organisations/Entities

Council received the minutes of meetings for the Southern & Hills Local Government Association held on 21 August 2020 and the Fleurieu Region Community Services Advisory Committee held on 13 October 2020.

## Nunga Screen

On Tuesday 10 November Country Arts SA and the District Council of Yankalilla presented Nunga Screen as a part of NAIDOC week celebrations. This is the first time Nunga Screen has been shown in Yankalilla and over 70 community members came out in support of this great initiative.

The sounds of local Ngarrindjeri man, Owen Love playing the didgeridoo, could be heard as people arrived at Club Fleurieu. The evening began with a sharing of music from Owen and singer/songwriter Kylie Kain. The Club Fleurieu were generous and supportive hosts, providing a perfect venue for an evening which was dedicated to bringing communities together to share in culture. We were fortunate that local Kurna elder, Susan Roberts and her daughter Janaya, were available to offer a greeting in language to open the evenings program.

Nunga Screen has been inspired by the National Film & Sound Archive's Black Screen program, Nunga (Aboriginal people of southern South Australia) Screen is presented by Country Arts SA and the 'Give up Smokes for Good' campaign from Drug and Alcohol Services of South Australia (DASSA), with support from the South Australian Film Corporation.

Unfortunately, the evening was bought to an abrupt end when a spectacular lightening show shut off all the power in Yankalilla. As there were still five movies to share with the audience plans are underway to show these films at a later date.

The feedback from the evening was very positive and we look forward to hosting Nunga screen as a regular NAIDOC event in coming years.



## Proposed Pedestrian Refuge Yankalilla

Consultation Period 13 November 2020 to 13 December 2020

Council has been asked by the Department of Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) to seek community feedback on DIT's proposal for a pedestrian refuge located on Main South Road in front of the Yankalilla Foodland and Browse In and Save near Bungala Street, Yankalilla.

In 2015 a petition was presented to the Minister for Road Safety for the "installation of pedestrian lights" in Yankalilla. Following a pedestrian and vehicle survey, DIT provided Council with a concept plan for the installation of a pedestrian refuge together with the following clarifications:

- The survey indicated high pedestrian activity, however there wasn't enough traffic to warrant a Pedestrian Actuated Crossing (PAC) (ie; pedestrian lights).
- Consequently, the department would not nominate a PAC for funding and even if nominated would certainly be a lower priority than many other sites across the State.

- As an alternative option and to improve pedestrian safety a refuge was also investigated. It was found that a refuge will deliver improved safety outcomes and will not affect street parking as much a PAC would, therefore less impact on businesses.
- 5-6 carparks will be lost, depending on the final detail design. (3-4 on the Browse In and Save side of the road and 2 on the Foodland / Bakery side).
- There is currently no funding for any work at this location.
- Prior to any funding bid being submitted for a refuge, consultation will need to be undertaken to determine the community and Council's support for the project.

Council staff have personally visited the business operators in the area and written to all the affected property owners.

We now want to hear from the general community, please tell us if you support DIT's proposal or not.

### Community Land Management Plan for Second Valley Springs Consultation Period 30 October 2020 to 11 December 2020

The Second Valley Springs were previously located on a Council road reserve, Council has undertaken

the road closure process and following completion of that process must adopt a community land management plan (CLMP). The proposed CLMP outlines the purpose the land is being held for is the ongoing protection and monitoring of the freshwater springs.

# \$100,000 in Community Funding Allocated

This financial year Council allocated a total of \$100,000 for Community funding which was allocated as follows:

- Myponga Community Centre, \$25,000
- Community initiatives to celebrate New Year's Eve, \$5,000
- Yankalilla Memorial Park, \$25,000
- Festival Fleurieu, \$15,000
- Community Grants Scheme, \$25,000

The Community Grants Scheme provides a support mechanism for community groups within the Yankalilla District to help with projects and events. Council received 26 applications from many different community groups totalling funding requests of \$48,118.



At the November Council meeting the Community Grants Scheme funding of \$25,000 was allocated. In addition to the \$25,000, several Elected Members choose to donate the increase in their Council Member allowance and additional amounts to the Community Grant program.

The Community Grant funding was allocated as below, with the following additions:

- Cr. Quirke donated \$200 to reference 13 Yankalilla & District Over 50s Club
- Cr. Rothwell donated \$135 to reference 24 Myponga Primary School

- Cr. Spilsbury donated \$108 for reference 23 Yankalilla District Inter Church Council
- Cr. Zarins and Cr. Verwey both donated \$108 each for reference 9 Yankalilla Area School

Mayor Glen Rowlands donated a total of \$1,080 to Fleurieu Trails for their Mountain Bike project.

Council will also provide an In-Kind Contribution to the Second Valley Progress Association for nursery tubestock and bunting, signage and site closure during works.
