# Marine Debris Program

Marine debris – or sea litter – is an environmental issue that affects marine animals and coastal environments worldwide. Green Adelaide’s Marine Debris Program volunteers have been surveying the District Council of Yankalilla and surrounding council beaches since 2010 on a biannual basis.

Marine debris includes a wide range of plastic and non-plastic materials including straws, bottles, food packaging and fishing-related waste. Not only is it unsightly, but it has extremely dangerous (and often fatal) impacts on wildlife.

The long-term goal is to understand the types of litter and where this marine debris is coming from, particularly impacting Gulf St Vincent, Yorke and Fleurieu Peninsulas and Kangaroo Island in South Australia. The information collected from the program contributes to informing the South Australian Single Use Plastic Ban (2021) and nationwide investigation and database into marine plastic pollution.

During November, 30 beaches were surveyed by volunteers across the coast with Rapid Bay being surveyed by Council/Green Adelaide’s Coastal Conservation Officer and staff from the Hills and Fleurieu Landscape SA Board. The process involves walking along the beach in a line together to gather all marine debris from the beach and then sort, weigh and record.



## 2020 Oct-Dec - Total number of items

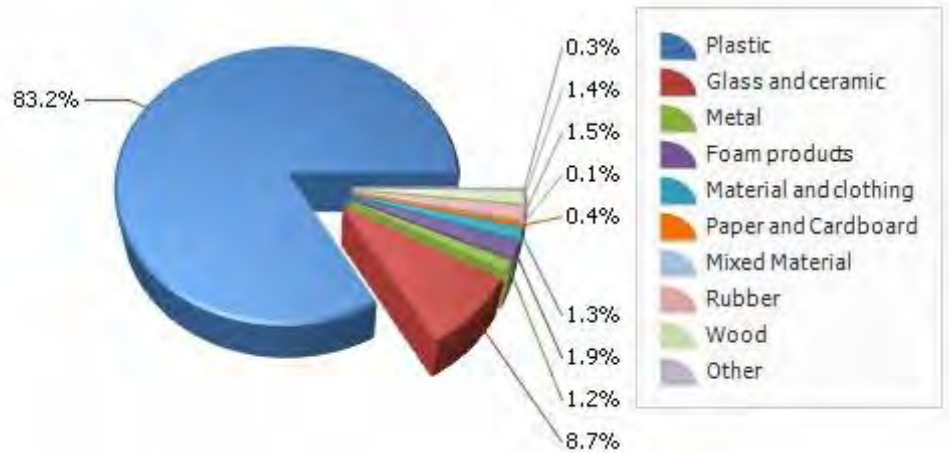


Figure 1: 2020 total area survey result had plastic as the main marine debris with 83.2%

# FLEURIEU COAST Community Network



Cost of living, homelessness, alcohol and other drugs were the big topic of conversation at the Fleurieu Coast Community Network (FCCN) meeting on Monday 5th December.

Guest speakers for the evening included Matt Gerts from Australian Drug Foundation, who provided valuable insights to the statistics of drug and alcohol use and the Local Drug Action Team program that will be implemented in the Yankalilla region. Following Matt, Lia Aldridge from Junction Australia shared eye-opening information about the increasing levels of homelessness in the Fleurieu region. Local community group 5CY was referred to and is a valuable community volunteer-based service that provides local families in the District Council of Yankalilla with food, vouchers and, at this time of year, Christmas gifts donated by the community.

The FCCN was established to build our community's capacity, using existing strengths in place such as groups already formed, skills developed and assets within our District. The Network aims to create meaningful connections within our community, to provide support and build capacity for those with worries, concerns and achievements. In addition, the Network aims to facilitate a smoother communication channel between organisations within our District.

The next meeting will be on Wednesday 1st February 2023 at 5-7pm at the Council Chambers.

# Major Projects Update

## Normanville Surf Life Saving Club/ Kiosk

Pile driving was completed last week and works to remove the sand is currently underway. Integrated heritage attended last week as we removed the last section of sand dune with no findings to report. Leading into the Christmas Break, we are working on getting the rubble pad down ready for digging foundations and pipe laying in the New Year. We are aiming to establish an early dialogue to discuss tenancy arrangements in 2023.

## Normanville Foreshore

In exciting news, Stage 1: plaza, lawn and nature play areas are expected to be opened to the public in mid-December. Council parks and gardens staff will continue undertaking minor landscaping works throughout these areas, including installing post and rail fencing along the top of the dunes.

As significant construction works are being undertaken at the SLSC/Kiosk site, requiring the movement of heavy vehicles throughout the foreshore area, a temporary bituminous seal and line marking has been undertaken throughout the Carpark area. The

final asphalt seal will be placed once the SLSC Kiosk/Cafe build is to a stage where the new seal will not be detrimentally affected by the construction works. Council's infrastructure team is assessing tender submissions for the District-wide sealing program, including asphalt sealing of the Foreshore car park, so the final timeframe will be negotiated with a successful sealing contractor. Council's Infrastructure team will also be investigating the opportunity to undertake the sealing of the Normanville Foreshore with an alternative asphalt product like what has been utilised in recent years on a number of roads within Normanville.

Due to material shortages and inclement weather, construction of the two new beach accesses and shelters has been slightly delayed. Works are proceeding on these structures with the beach accesses being constructed onsite and shelter currently being manufactured offsite ready for delivery. Works will be continuing through December and January on both the beach accesses and shelter, with these facilities to open to the public as soon as works are complete.

The need for additional shelter over the new playground has been identified. Investigation is currently being undertaken for a sail or suitable similar structure to be provided within the nature play area. Due to the engineering and planning requirements of such a feature, it is expected that these works would be undertaken as part of stage 2 of the Foreshore works.

SA Power Networks (SAPN) will install a new transformer within the Foreshore Precinct in early 2023. Council's project team are currently working with SAPN to provide the new transformer in a location which is both safe and convenient and for SAPN while also not detracting from the aesthetics of the updated Foreshore.

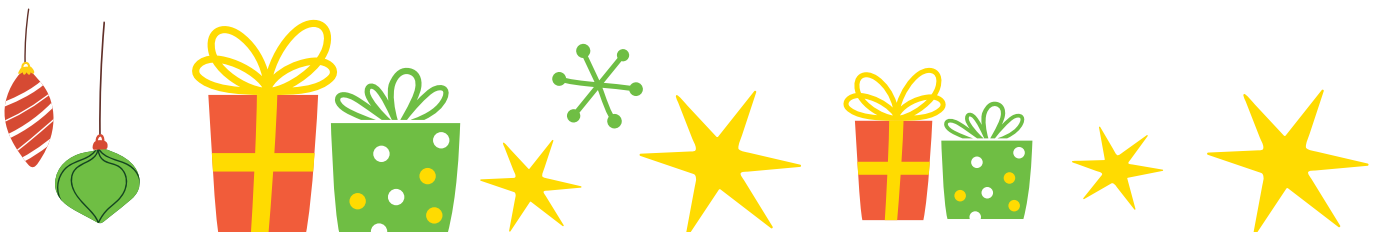
Council's project team is currently in discussion with Partek Construction regarding the timing for the delivery of stage 2 of the plaza works. Once a works program is confirmed Council will provide notification to the community regarding these upcoming works.

Yankalilla Library Fit Out continues.

**Forktree Road Sealing**

After significant delays due to inclement weather, the final sealing of the unsealed section of Forktree Road was completed in early December. Speed restrictions will remain in place until mid to late December while loose stone settles into the spray seal. Line marking is expected to be completed Late-December (subject to weather) and speed restrictions can then be removed.

Minor ancillary works will continue until the end of the year addressing roadside drainage, signage, and road shoulders. It is expected that all works will be complete by early-January 2023.

**Yankalilla Cultural Centre and Library**

Building and Fit Out:

The Library build is nearing completion and the initial preliminary shelving/stocking has now commenced. Building Solutions (the Builder) noted some delays associated with complex responses to RFI's submitted by Harmonic design (the designer).

The Library interior fit out is now 90% complete. Some minor material changes (carpet tiles) have been requested to improve the overall experience for all users.

**Carpark**

The Construction and sealing of Thomas Drive (Library Carpark) is now complete. Ancillary works around the car parking areas will continue to be undertaken prior to the new library facility's opening. Council's infrastructure and depot operations teams are investigating and will be undertaking additional landscaping and storm water drainage works around the site in the new year. These works include but are not limited to;

- Reinstating irrigation lost through the construction of the Library Building, car park, and pump track.
- Formation of garden beds, and reinstatement of lawn throughout the reserve.
- Undertaking planting of landscaped areas including the raingardens within Thomas Drive with appropriate native plants
- Construction of storm water management infrastructure throughout the reserve to manage runoff from existing infrastructure as well as from the new library building and pump track.

**Second Valley Soldiers Memorial Hall**

The Hall has received a new fit out to the kitchen and other areas including flooring, kitchen storage/cupboards and appliances. A \$50K grant from the Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) has been dispersed to the Second Valley Hall upon receipt of invoice and the project is on track for completion in 2023.

**Cape Jervis Boat Ramp**

Work to improve the concrete boat ramp and install a new floating pontoon is nearing completion with a final pylon to be added to minimize movement. The project has been funded using a PIRSA grant of \$140K and Council contribution of \$79K. Grant reporting has been completed with monies received by Council.

A Head Agreement has been executed, giving Council license for the site (a peppercorn agreement of \$1 for 9 years, which will expire 31 August 2030). Council is responsible for maintenance, repairs improvements, insurance and public liability. Council retains maintenance responsibilities for the car park area.

## Where can I park?

Friendly reminder from our parking inspectors

### Adverse Parking

Everyone wants to enjoy our beautiful District and whether you reside here or you are visiting, we ask that you adhere to the Australian Road Rules and do not park your vehicle adverse to traffic.

Vehicles parked on a road or road related area are required to position the vehicle to face the same direction as the moving traffic on that side of the road (ie lawful direction). In order to re-join traffic, vehicles parked against the flow of traffic must cross to the opposite side of the road, which could endanger other road users.

This is an offence and can incur an expiation.

This includes Second Valley at the end of Finnis Vale Drive, which is a gazetted road.

Arrows have been placed on the road to indicate the direction in which vehicles must travel. There are both parallel parking and 90° parking bays in this area.

Vehicles parking parallel must do so to position their vehicle to face the lawful direction.



### Blocking Pedestrian Paths and Bikeways

Council has been receiving feedback regarding the issue of parked cars blocking the shared pedestrian and bikeway path.

Road users are reminded that unless a sign permits you to do otherwise, you must not stop or park your vehicle on or across a driveway (or other way of access for vehicles to private land) unless you are dropping off or picking up passengers within 2 minutes of stopping and you do not leave the vehicle unattended. In addition, you must not stop or park your vehicle on or across a footpath, or a footpath ramp.

The blocking of footpaths by motorists presents a serious risk for children, seniors and people with disabilities.

Have a happy holiday and lets all work together to keep each other safe.



# Fire Prevention

Be bushfire ready

Fire danger season commenced on the 1st December 2022.

It is essential to know the risk in the area and be prepared by completing a five-minute bushfire plan, ensuring your property is ready, and knowing how to stay informed.

# Summer Waste Collection Schedule 2022-23

To help our community recycle more, FRWA and council will double the collection of yellow Recycling and green Food Organics Garden Organics bins over the six-week summer holiday period.

The six WEEKLY collections of Recycling bins and Green bins (in eligible townships) over the peak of summer will be on your normal collection day and begin the week of 19th December 2022 and finish the week of 27th January 2023.

Please note that General Waste to Landfill bins (including those with any EC Exceptional Circumstances bins) will continue to be collected fortnightly during this period.

Over the six-week Christmas and New Year holiday period, recycling and food waste increases, therefore it is important to provide more capacity

for residents to use their recycling and green bins during this time.

This change will increase waste disposal capacity by more than 200% over the six-week period, providing an increase in service to residents who generally have more materials to dispose of. For those residents outside of townships that do not have a green bin, there is still an increase in capacity with weekly recycling collections instead of the smaller general waste to landfill bin.

This change follows a two-year investigation into the best way to provide more opportunity for households to recycle more and reduce waste sent to landfill, with most of the extra waste generated over the Christmas/New year period being food and packaging. Don't forget, food waste can now go into your green bin, along with your

garden waste, and please ensure only compostable bags are used, available at a reduced price at Councils and the Fleurieu Regional Waste depot in Yankalilla, Goolwa and Strathalbyn.

The change will provide a significant increase in capacity of waste disposal, even for those with only a weekly recycling collection (see attached graphic showing OLD/NEW capacity).

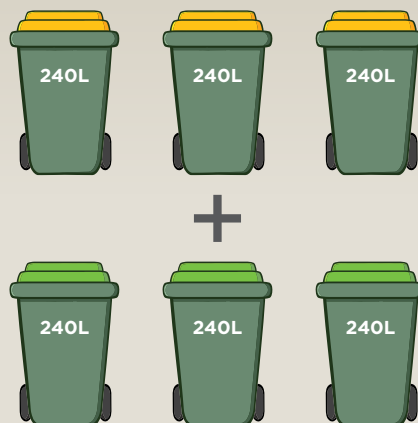
