She appreciates the uniqueness of each community and is looking forward to supporting those who use the Yankalilla Library now and those who will, in the future. Kath is excited about the times ahead and the programs,

services and support her team can provide across the Council area.

"The Yankalilla Library, as part of the One Card network, is connected to over 130 public libraries across the state, under the banner of LibrariesSA, giving us thousands of choices and a diverse range of items to explore, programs to be a part of and services to help you," Kath said.

Yankalilla Library Service boasts a team of helpful staff and volunteers, combined with a range of services that visit, to support locals in outreach services. We regularly have staff from Aged Rights Advocacy Service (ARAS) to support aged people in understanding their rights,

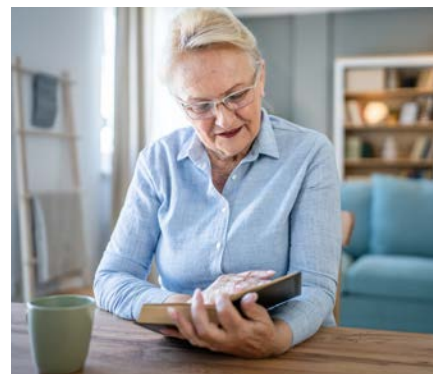

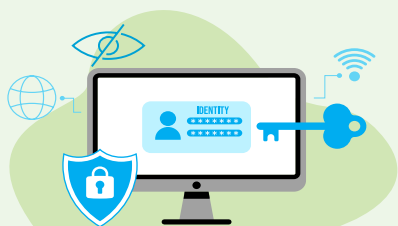

Due to the resignation of Cr Bill Verwey, a supplementary election will be necessary to fill the vacancy of Councillor in the Light Ward.

Enrol to Vote

You are entitled to vote in the election if you are enrolled on the State electoral roll for the council area. If you have recently turned 18 or changed your residential or postal address, you must complete an electoral enrolment form available online at www.ecsa.sa.gov.au.

If you are not eligible to enrol on the State electoral roll you may still be entitled to vote if you own or occupy a property in the council area. Contact Council or ECSA to find out how.

The voters roll for this supplementary election will close at 5pm on Tuesday, 30 April 2024.

Nominations

Nominations to fill the vacancy will open on Thursday, 23 May 2024 and will be received until 12 noon on Thursday, 6 June 2024.

Voting

The election will be conducted entirely by post. Enrolled voters will receive a voting package through the mail and can return their votes in a reply-paid envelope. Ballot material must reach the Returning Officer no later than 12 noon on polling day, Monday, 22 July 2024.

Fleurieu AGFEST 2024




With Fleurieu AGFEST done and dusted for another year, a meeting will be organised to set the next date and discuss how next year's event will be planned and run. For example, will a working group or a different structure be best?

Feedback from schools has been very positive and 100% of survey respondents so far would like to see AGFEST run again.

Changes and improvements under consideration include the following:

- Potential changes to timing for exhibitors – ie times when displays will be open and close, whether we can enable exhibitors to participate in the workshops and other parts of the program.
- Getting the Dirt Road Trail student activity out to teachers earlier and offering a prize for the best Dirt Road Trail for a student from each school.
- An idea to seek support for the Show Society to get some more power points so that exhibitors can be better clustered and to enable better flexibility in layout of displays, as well as potentially some well-labelled bin banks (to minimise waste to landfill).
- Simpler scheduling and clearer booking systems for the afternoon workshops for the school groups.
- Ensure that there isn't a gap in the program on the main stage for the general public.
- See if we can align with any other events (such as the Dairy SA Central Region conference) to boost producer numbers.

How to Handle Riskier Foods – Unpasteurised Milk and Cheese



Nearly all dairy products in Australia, such as milk, cheese and yoghurt, are pasteurised. This means they have been heat treated for a short period to kill any bacteria. Pasteurisation has done a great deal to reduce food borne disease over the years.

It is illegal to sell unpasteurised (raw) cow's milk in Australia for human consumption and health authorities recommend that it should not be consumed.

There are also a few unpasteurised hard or semi-hard cheeses imported into Australia including extra hard type cheeses (parmesan types), the Swiss cheeses Emmental, Gruyere and Sbrinz, and Roquefort cheese but these have to undergo strict production processes and testing. They must be labelled that they have not been pasteurised.

Vulnerable people such as pregnant women, people with reduced immune systems, the elderly or young children should not consume raw milk or raw milk cheeses as they can get seriously ill if they get food poisoning.

If you milk your own cow or goat, always ensure that it is healthy and here is a simple method to pasteurise milk at home:

1. Using a double boiler, place the milk in the top and water in the bottom.
2. Place an accurate, metal-stem thermometer and spoon in the milk during the entire pasteurisation process. A metal-stem thermometer is preferred over glass because it will not break.
3. Heat the milk, while stirring constantly to 75°C and hold it at that temperature for no less than 15 seconds. Constant stirring is important for obtaining even distribution of the heat and to ensure that all the milk is heated to 75°C.
4. At the end of the 15-second holding time, place the top portion of the double boiler containing the milk in a pan of cold water. Continue stirring the milk to achieve rapid cooling.
5. When the milk temperature is below 55°C, replace the cooling water with ice water and continue to cool the milk, with occasional stirring, until the temperature is 5°C or below.
6. Pour the cooled milk into clean containers, cover, and store in the refrigerator at 5°C or colder until used.

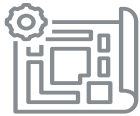

Council received the report and supported the addition of a further one (1) disability carparking space at the Normanville shopping centre to proceed to a phase of consultation with stakeholders.

Encumbrance Waiver - Mitchell Heights, Normanville

Council received the report and agreed to waive clause 6.1 to allow the use of the external wall material Sycon Linea at Number 3 Allotment 320 in Deposited Plan 52117 Mitchell Heights, Normanville.

Ancillary Accommodation and Student Accommodation Definitions Review Code Amendment

Council received the report and approved the draft letter addressed to the Chief Executive, Department for Trade and Investment, in Attachment A, as the Council submission.

Cape Jervis Harbour Precinct Master Plan Submission

Council received the report and resolved to endorse the Draft Submission on the Cape Jervis Harbour Precinct Master Plan, to be sent to the Department of Infrastructure & Transport and relevant MPs, Ministers and Community Groups.

Economic Development Strategy 2020-2025 – Implementation Plan Annual Update

Council received the report. Council noted the year-to-date progress report (1 June 2023 to 31 March 2024) on implementation of the Economic Development Strategy 2020-2025.

Dog and Cat Registration Fees 2024-2025

Council received the report and endorsed an increase of equal amounts to both the Dog and Cat Registration Fees for 2024/25 Financial Year, this being a 4.4% increase. Council resolved to approve the waiver of 2023/24 Fees for New Dog and Cat Registrations received during the month of June 2024.

Draft 2024-25 Annual Business Plan & Budget and Long-Term Financial Plan for Consultation Report

The report was received and Council endorsed the draft 2024-25 Annual Business Plan & Budget and Long-Term Financial Plan for public consultation. Council resolved that consultation will be carried out as set out in the Engagement Plan.

Council resolved: to support a reduction in the level of capital investment when compared to the prior three budget periods, a principal of annual sustainability that sees Councils plans to include operating within its financial means in 2024-25 without increasing the level of borrowing and the inclusion of a 5.6% total rate revenue increase, \$1,100 minimum rate and 20% Rebate – capping.

Council resolved to hold three public consultation meetings following which, a revised version of the Annual Business Plan & Budget and Long-Term Financial Plan will be brought to Council's Special Meeting provisionally to be scheduled on 25 June 2024.
