NATIONAL TREE DAY PLANTING IN CARRICKALINGA

The annual community planting event, previously at Bungala Park, this year shifted to a reserve adjacent to Carrickalinga Road on Sunday 26 July.

Council staff prepared the site and linked with the Normanville Natural Resource Centre community group.

The NNRC group planted and guarded using local native plants that they grew themselves, with additional plants funded by the Adelaide & Mt Lofty Ranges Natural Resources Coast and Marine Program.

500 trees and shrubs in total were planted in 1½ hours thanks to the hard work of 45 volunteers.

The group then made their way back to the Resource Centre for a well deserved lunch and to warm up.

MAYOR'S CORNER

The winter blues are over and everyone would be feeling the warmth and starting to get outside doing those jobs that have built up. Council's unsealed roads are no different and there has been a lot of pain for everyone. The elected members are approaching this short fall. So you can get a better picture have a look at September's Council meeting agenda and follow it through to the minutes. In short there has not been enough money allocated to our unsealed roads for some years. While this has helped get our finances in shape in the short term it will take quite a few years and a lot of effort to get the unsealed roads to an acceptable standard.

A long term plan for the road network will be developed as part of reviewing our Asset Management Plans which will be presented to Council to plan for funding and resourcing. Keep an eye on the website for information as it evolves.

The search for a new Chief Executive is well under way and the recruiter has reported that there is a lot of interest, both from within Local Government and Commerce based individuals.

The State Government has introduced a Bill to Parliament to significantly revamp the way in which development is assessed within South Australia. The Bill proposes to strengthen the Minister of Planning's powers, and at a briefing on 14 September we were informed about how local Development Plans will be replaced by a State Planning and Design Code and a more regionalised approach to setting planning policy. Council's will have less say in day to day development assessment with Local Development Assessment Panels replaced with Regional Panels that do not have any local elected member representatives.

Council's throughout the State will be advocating to retain local representation and responsibilities for development control.

YOUR SAY YANKALILLA

Local Heritage – Places and Spaces within the Yankalilla district

Council is revisiting the places identified in a regional Heritage Survey of the Fleurieu Peninsula in 1985. At that time, no local heritage was formally recognised, although a handful of the 57 places recommended as State places, were listed. In the years since, some of the buildings in the survey have been demolished. The places identified as being of local significance, were broadly categorised as relevant to a historic theme (for example, early settlement, local industries, notable people, religion, etc.)

The heritage review is an opportunity to rethink which places and spaces should be recognised by the community as being of heritage significance. Council is inviting the community to identify places and spaces that are important to them. These may include both natural and cultural heritage. The end result of the review will be to prepare guidelines to help protect and conserve heritage.

Owners of structures that may be historically significant will be consulted prior to any decisions to formally recognise a heritage place. The aim is to encourage the continued use and enjoyment of heritage by owners whilst retaining those features that make the place historic. Opportunities to enable Local Heritage places to be developed for tourism related uses will be investigated as a means to encourage the re-use and retention of buildings.
