NOTE:

Litter can be any object disposed of by a person, either onto land or into any waters whether by a pedestrian, from a vehicle, or from a premises. Disposing of litter also means discarding or depositing litter or allowing litter to be blown from, or to fall from a premises or vehicle. Where the disposal occurs from a vehicle the liability for the offence rests with the owner of the vehicle. Illegal dumping is a significant form of littering usually conducted in associations with a vehicle of some description.
