Elections are when you get a real say

In between elections governments want your opinions but when you vote, it counts to make the decision.

Who will steer your community for the next four years? Who will represent your area to State and Federal governments? Who will make decisions about your library, your roads, public spaces, parks and sporting facilities? Who will determine how much rates are raised and how they are spent?

The answer is: The people who win your Council election.

So how do I vote?

Unlike State and Federal elections, the election comes to you via the post. You don't have to go to a voting booth. Ballot papers are posted to you along with a booklet about candidates. You vote with numbers — "I" for your first preference and where there is more than one position you vote "2" for your

second preference and so on up to the number of vacancies to be filled or for all candidates.

You will receive ballot papers between 22 – 26 October. We suggest you vote immediately, place the papers in the special reply-paid envelope provided following instructions carefully and post it straight back.

Envelopes must reach the Electoral Commission by 5pm on Friday 9 November.

Then electoral officers count all the votes and results will be published the following week on Council's website.

IT'S TIME TO ACT

The winter season has been dry and warmer weather is already upon us. Now is the time for land owners to prepare for the fire danger season and there are some legal requirements to consider.

All vegetation* (grass, pest plants and undergrowth) is to be reduced to a maximum height of 100mm in the following circumstances:

- Within 20 metres of any building
- Entire vacant blocks under half a hectare in size
- A five-metre-wide strip fire break must be maintained around the entire perimeter of vacant blocks over half a hectare in size

ALL fire prevention measures are to be completed by the commencement of the fire danger season (dates determined by the CFS) and Council will be regularly patrolling to assess properties.

Council's Fire Prevention Team may issue a hazard reduction notice to the owner of any parcel of land that poses a fire risk. If the risk is not attended to by the owner Council may undertake the required maintenance at the owner's expense.

* Native vegetation is protected under the Native Vegetation Act 1991 which provides certain exemptions for fire prevention.

Microchipping helps get wandering dogs and cats home safe!

Council's Rangers do their best to reunite dogs and cats with their owners if they are found wandering. The more information you



provide to us through registration the sooner they can get your beloved pet back to you.

Did you know that the next step after a stray dog or cat is impounded by Council and an owner cannot be located or contacted is the animal is moved on to the RSPCA at Lonsdale? If it's not claimed within three days then the animal is assessed either to be re-homed or euthanised.

Having your dogs and cats microchipped is so helpful in getting them home – and it's a state wide mandatory requirement. Fines do apply for not having your dogs and cats microchipped and YES this applies to working dogs too.

Lost Pets of South Australia offers \$10 microchipping at various locations across the state and Council will be teaming up with them to run its fourth Chipblitz on Sunday, 9 December at the Council Chambers (1 Charles Street, Yankalilla).
