CEO CORNER

Proposed transfer of Sewerage (CWMS) and Water Assets to SA Water

At the September 2018 Council meeting, Council considered a report on the proposed transfer to SA Water. Given that the decision is a major one that will affect many people and have an impact on Council's finances in the short-term a decision was made to collect more information and present to the new Council following the November 2018 Council Elections.

Additional changes to Dog Controls on Beaches

In addition to the recent creation of a permanent "Dog off Leash" and "Dog on Leash" area at Normanville/Carrickalinga and the shortening of the period of controls from being during "Daylight Savings period" to now being from I December to end of February and Good Friday to Easter Monday (inclusive) additional changes have now been made.

At the September 2018 Council meeting the beach controls at Rapid Bay and Second Valley were changed. Previously dogs were required to be on a leash between 10am and 6pm every day of the year. This has now been changed to require the leash to be in use between 10am and 6pm only in the busier periods of 1 December to end of February and Good Friday to Easter Monday (inclusive), outside of these times dogs can be let off the leash but must remain in effective control.

Also, at the September meeting, "Shelly Beach" (From Little Gorge outlet to I km south of Little Gorge outlet) was returned to a "Dog Free at all times beach, all year round").

The team are now in the process of organising appropriate signage for all our beaches to ensure everyone is aware of the controls in place, where appropriate we will be consolidating the existing signage in place (it is often reported we have way too many signs) and will be ensuring we take away the old signs.

When we are notified of nesting birds on the beach we will be roping off the area and alerting beach goers of their existence and requiring that all dogs are placed on the leash while around the nests.

Dogs under effective control at Myponga

Council has received several reports of "Dogs wandering at large" within the township of Myponga, especially in and around the oval. Dog owners are reminded that dogs need be kept in effective control at all times.

What does "under effective control" mean?

To ensure the safety and enjoyment of all our visitors, owners are required to have their dog under effective control at all times. A dog is considered to be under effective control (on or off-leash when):

- Your dog is within 50 metres of you and can be seen at all times
- Your dog is in close proximity to you
- Your dog will return to your side by responding to your voice command, whistle or hand signal immediately
- You are able to control your dog in any circumstance
- Your dog does not chase, harass or cause a nuisance to any person, animal or bird

'Road works ahead' at Second Valley

The stormwater systems, kerbing and road sealing of Boathaven Drive and part of Recreation Drive (from Finniss Vale Drive to Boathaven Drive) at Second Valley will be given an upgrade before Christmas. Baldock Earthmoving are carrying out the works, which commenced mid-September and are expected to run through until early December.

Unsealed roads get a spring clean

The post-winter grading program for the district's unsealed road network is underway. Council's Operations Team are working hard to ensure it's ready for heavier traffic loads over the summer visitor season. Please take care when driving on unsealed roads and keep an eye out for work-zone signage and plant equipment.

FREE Dump Pass for Non-Township Residents

Council at its September meeting resolved to offer one free green waste dump pass to all ratepayers that are not currently provided a green organics collection service.

Ratepayers in this category will need to visit the Council Office to pick up a free Green Waste Dump Pass to be used within the financial year. This pass is to be presented at the gates of the Yankalilla Waste & Recycling Depot, 2864 Inman Valley Road. The pass will allow a maximum of a single axle trailer up to 6x4 heaped.

In between elections governments want your opinions but when you vote, it counts to make the decision.

Who will steer your community for the next four years? Who will represent your area to State and Federal governments? Who will make decisions about your library, your roads, public spaces, parks and sporting facilities? Who will determine how much rates are raised and how they are spent?

The answer is: The people who win your Council election.

Get involved and make a difference

Local democracy is an important feature of life in Australia, and councils have a far greater influence on communities than most people appreciate. Make a difference by participating in your council election.

Caretaker Period

The District Council of Yankalilla will be in Caretaker Period from Tuesday 18 September 2018 until the conclusion of the Local Government Elections. Council's Caretaker Policy will apply during this period. View the policy on Council's website www.yankalilla.sa.gov.au/policies

So how do I vote?

Unlike State and Federal elections, the election comes to you via the post. You don't have to go to a voting booth. Ballot papers are posted to you along with a booklet about candidates. You vote with numbers —"I" for your first preference and where there is more than one position you vote "2" for you second preference and so on up to the number of vacancies to be filled or for all candidates.

You will receive ballot papers between 22 – 26 October. We suggest you vote immediately, place the papers in the special reply-paid envelope provided following instructions carefully and post it straight back.

Envelopes must reach the Electoral Commission by 5pm on Friday 9 November.

Then electoral officers count all the votes and results will be published the following week on Council's website.

OPTUS SWITCHES ON 50TH MOBILE BLACK SPOT SITE AT PARAWA

Optus has switched on its 50th Mobile Black Spot Site in Parawa. The new mobile site was co-funded by Optus and the Federal and South Australian Governments and will provide significantly improved mobile reception in the Parawa area.

Vin Mullins, Manager Mobile Planning at Optus, praised the tenacity of the local community in pushing for this site to form part of the Government's Mobile Black Spot Program. He said: "The Yankalilla Council and community were instrumental in getting this site off the ground, knowing the positive impact dedicated mobile coverage would have on the area," he said.

Mayor Glen Rowlands said: "As a community we have been waiting for this new tower for many years. The high producing agricultural region of Parawa has had little to no mobile accessibility until now and I know that this new Optus tower will change the way we live and do business here. Having reliable mobile coverage is critical for Parawa. It will not only provide an additional layer of safety for the community but will also help drive revenue for local businesses as well as providing coverage for tourists wishing to highlight the natural beauty of the region to friends and family back home."

MYPONGA AND SURROUNDS ACCESS NBN™ NETWORK

Homes and businesses in Myponga and surrounds are increasingly accessing high-speed broadband services, following the May 2018 launch of nbn™ access services. Check your individual address at www.nbn.com.au

In most cases NBN Co can connect a premises to the nbn™ Fixed Wireless service within 28 days of an order being placed with a phone and internet provider. This will depend on where your premises is located in relation to an nbn™ Fixed Wireless tower.

Switching to the nbnTM access network is not automatic. Contact your phone or internet provider to get your nbnTM powered plan. They will arrange an nbnTM powered plan to suit your needs, installation scheduling, and your retail services (eg internet, phone, or both).

Parking, parking, parking... the busy season is approaching

The busy summer season is approaching, signalling the arrival of more road users in our townships. To make sure the pedestrian areas are kept safe Council has adopted a no-tolerance approach towards those who park their vehicles illegally or obstruct footpaths and other pedestrian areas.

Remember, vehicles that obstruct pedestrian areas can be real obstacles for cyclists and pedestrians, particularly those using mobility aids and prams. Council's Compliance team will be applying fines where breaches occur.

COMMUNITY RESTORING HABITAT FOR THE GLOSSY BLACK COCKATOO

The last planting event for the season was held on Sunday 26 August at Wirrina Coastal Reserve with approximately 1,500 local native plants being planted. Community volunteers assisted with growing most of the plants and planting across 32 hectares of council reserves at Wirrina. The aim of the project is to create more suitable habitat for the Glossy Black Cockatoo at Wirrina. Fire resistant plant species are being planted throughout the mix and near houses. The District Council of Yankalilla and Natural Resources Adelaide Mt

Lofty Ranges in partnership with Conservation Volunteers Australia are success rolling out this Federal Government 20 Million Trees Grant. Reports of wandering livestock are on the rise

Recently Council has seen a rise in the number of reports of livestock wandering on roads and into private property where they should not be. If you are an owner of livestock you are legally responsible to keep your animals contained. Council's Compliance team encourages livestock owners to take the next opportunity to check boundary fencing and make sure all necessary upgrades are carried out to ensure your animals stay at home.

Fines may be issued for stock wandering on roads, and Council is authorised to take further action if stock wander repeatedly.







AUTOMATED EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATORS A.E.D

District Council of Yankalilla has joined the long list of people and organisations committed to saving lives by purchasing and installing 24-hour access Automated External Defibrillators, or AEDs, at two of its buildings – The Centre and Civic Centre.

AEDs are a life-saving device used to treat sudden cardiac arrest. The AED, or 'Defib', analyses the heart rhythm, recognises abnormalities and assesses whether a shock is required to be delivered to the person affected.

Council's Community Services Team is currently conducting an audit of all AEDs in the Fleurieu Coast area to raise awareness in the community of their locations.
