

A Further \$2.1 Million in Grant Funding Secured for Normanville Foreshore

Deputy Premier Vickie Chapman MP has announced that the District Council of Yankalilla has been awarded \$2.1 million from the Marshall Liberal Government Open Spaces and Places for People Grant program for the Normanville Foreshore project.

The funding will go towards an increased green space, a new family nature play area, a new plaza area and new beach interface including jetty mobility access and boardwalk reconfiguration and integration of the new Normanville Surf Life Saving Club & Kiosk building to the public realm.

Mayor Glen Rowlands said, "This is a major win for Council especially considering the pool of funds in this grant round was \$22.3 million and we are to receive \$2.1 million, there were 43 Councils who applied for funding with only 27 projects across 21 Council areas being announced as successful".

"The funding of \$2,100,000 was leveraged with the Council committed contributions towards the Normanville Surf Lifesaving Club and Kiosk rebuild allowing us to bring forward the improvements and integration to the public spaces without committing more ratepayers funds".

"The project makes a significant contribution to community inclusion by improving public access for people of all abilities through direct and indirect mobility access interventions".

"The nature play element is provided as a family-friendly space and provides a destination for the winter period for the community".

"The new plaza is a key element in providing for better connectivity of the foreshore, providing a transition from the Surf Life Saving Club & Kiosk to the green space and is a meeting place for the community and visitors".

"Receiving the Open Spaces and Places for People grant now brings the secured external funding to a total of \$6,800,500 towards the Foreshore Masterplan projects and we eagerly await the results of other funding opportunities we have applied for", said Mayor Glen Rowlands.

Work continues on the Normanville Foreshore and Jetty Caravan Park Draft Masterplan which will be presented for consideration at the 15 June 2021 meeting of the Council. The plan will take into account all previous Council resolutions, including maintaining similar parking space numbers and green space areas.

It is proposed that Council contributes up to \$4,861,100 towards the \$11,661,600 of Foreshore Masterplan projects. The Cabins, Kiosk, and possibility the Surf Life Saving Club will then contribute income towards the debt reduction of \$4.8 million. All this will be considered by the Elected Members at the June meeting of the Council.

CEO's Corner

Ask the CEO (Nigel Morris)

Q1: Why wont the Council upgrade the Normanville Tennis Courts given the club has twice been nominated for Most Outstanding Rural Club?

I ask this because Victor Harbor has upgraded, Port Elliot, Goolwa, Back Valley and Victor Harbor courts, and when they play on ours we are very embarrassed at the condition, especially in the wet where they are very slippery and drains don't flow the water away.

There is also shrubbery and overgrowth through the fence at the beach end that appears to be of mixed responsibility. These are damaging the fence and are a hazard when walking past or playing on the run. The leaves cause slipperiness.

Please reassess and include the courts in their current position but in a safe and proud condition. - Wendy

A: The tennis courts at Normanville had minor maintenance to the cracking approximately 2 years ago and the courts have been assessed as nearing their end of life within 5 years.

At this stage we plan to reassess the courts in 3 years' time upon advice

from the Recreational Surfaces who conducted the assessment 2 years ago.

Council has a Licence Agreement with the Normanville Tennis Club which is due to renegotiated. The existing agreement sets out that structural maintenance is the responsibility of Council and general and ground maintenance is the responsibility of the Normanville Tennis Club, meaning the club is responsible for the surrounding grounds and bushes that a creating an issue to your playing surface.

As you are aware we are in the process of finalising the Normanville Foreshore & Jetty Caravan Park Masterplan which is likely to be presented to the June Meeting of Council. Until the Masterplan is endorsed we will not invest money into the courts as there is the possibility they may be reconfigured.

At this time Council does not have a budget allocated to improve the courts but after the Masterplan is finalised I encourage the Normanville Tennis Club to put a business case to Council and work with us to seek external funding to resurface the courts and other improvements such as lighting.

Q2: With the sealing of Forktree Rd for the last 2 km at the Main South Rd end what study or consideration has been given to issues created by trucks travelling to and from Kangaroo Island rerouting through Carrickalinga along the entire stretch of Forktree Rd as opposed to the current route on Main South Rd through Yankalilla? - Paul

A: Council has completed a Road Safety Audit of the final section Forktree Road heading into Carrickalinga to assess any issues, which has resulted in changes to signage along the route.

Our Senior Engineer has advised that Forktree Road isn't conducive for truck drivers due to the gradients along the road and that the route through to Normanville is longer than taking Main South Road. Main South Road is also a gazetted B-double freight route which will not be applied to Forktree Road.

The existing unsealed road section of Forktree Road currently carries more traffic volume than that is desirable for an unsealed road. This requires excessive amounts of grading maintenance works, making the sealing of the road a more viable economic option long term for Council. It also addresses safety issues for road users who drive the route around to the Myponga Reservoir lookout.

A part of the role of the Mayor requires keeping our community connected to the Local Government Association, State and Federal Governments and with our neighbouring Councils. In the last 12 months I feel I have let some of these connections go, my energy and capacity is waning.

I will be taking extended leave over July and August but will remain an Elected Member until the end of the Council term.

At the end of the June Council Meeting I will vacate the chair and a new Principal Member (Mayor) will be chosen by the Elected Members.


The Great (Big) Gorge Walk

The Great Gorge Walk was officially opened by Councillor David Olsson on Sunday 30th May 2021. The walk has been a collaboration between the District Council of Yankalilla, Yankalilla District Historical Society & private landholders installing a new pedestrian access, sign posts and a series of information panels which allows this beautiful trail to be opened up for the public to enjoy.

Where: Start from Garnet Kelly Reserve, opposite 6790 Main South Rd, Normanville This 3.6km return walk runs adjacent to the Yankalilla River, on the route of the historic coach road, and the path Colonel William Light walked during his first surveys.

Today, walkers will enjoy prolific birdlife as they follow a marked trail of recent vehicle tracks and informal paths. Look out for river red gums, blue gums, blackwood, golden wattle and sheoak on the higher ground. Large swathes of grass trees are striking against the hills. This walk follows an unimproved path and you will encounter uneven and rocky surfaces and is open sunrise to sunset.

The path crisscrosses public road and private land, we acknowledge the generosity of landholders in allowing access.

The Cape Jervis Coastal Community Group have created a display garden with over 2,000 local native seedlings growing on this site, all with plant labels. The group has also created a nature play area that the students loved.



Help Name our New Second Valley Trail Network

ForestrySA is pleased to announce two new multi-use loop trails will soon be opening in the beautiful Second Valley Forest Reserve – but we need your help to name them!

The two new 7km long trails will begin at Bedlam Flat Road (off Range Road) and are suitable for walkers, horse riders and cyclists. They will follow the existing fire track network, traversing through a mixture of pine plantation, hardwood plantation and native vegetation.

Keep an eye out for the local Yellow Tailed Black Cockatoos and soaring Wedge Tailed Eagles along the way!

The new trails make up the first formalised trail network within the Second Valley Forest, providing new recreational opportunities and increased access to the reserve.

The development has been identified as a priority in District Council of Yankalilla's Tracks and Trails Strategic Action Plan. In support, Council will be establishing a visitor carpark off Bedlam Flat Road, providing suitable access for horse float parking.

\$250,000 Grant for Restoring Fleurieu Coastal and Marine Habitats

Landscape SA Hills and Fleurieu and Green Adelaide have worked with the District Council of Yankalilla hosted Coastal Conservation Officer to successfully gain \$250,000 over two years from the State Government's Landscape Priority fund.

The restoring of the Fleurieu coastal and marine habitats for wildlife conservation project will restore native habitats along the Fleurieu coast to improve the biodiversity values of this tourism asset. This includes building dune resilience against storm surges and improving habitat outcomes for beach-nesting birds. The funding will enable an extensive weed control and revegetation program, encompassing sections of the Wild South Coast Way.

The dune systems from Myponga Beach to Goolwa will have introduced grasses removed and be revegetated with the local native spinifex vegetation association. Replacement with native species will allow increased beach-nesting habitat for Hooded plovers and maintain breeding territories. Community awareness of the importance of Spinifex associations in dunes will be increased.

Normanville Foreshore and Jetty Caravan Park Draft Masterplan Consultation Period – No end date

Although Council continues to progress with the Draft Masterplan, Council at its meeting held 29 January 2021 resolved to leave the consultation period open beyond 31 January 2021, therefore you can submit your feedback along the way.

Council Decisions

The following will provide a summary of the May 2021 Council Meeting decisions. As always, we encourage you to read the complete agenda and minutes to get the details and a greater understanding of topics at www.yankalilla.sa.gov.au/council/agenda-and-minutes

Mayor's Report

The Mayor's Report was received where he highlighted discussions with the Yankalilla Lions Club about the planting of Morton Bay Fig trees in Normanville and another with the South Australian Coastal Council's Alliance where they are proposing to be involved with State and Federal Governments to assist coastal councils relating to climate change.

Mayor Rowlands also advised that Peter Fowler and Rachael Reeves will be leaving the District Council of Yankalilla with 23 years of service between them. Peter has worked with the Engineering/Infrastructure department delivering construction projects with the largest portion of Council's budget. The most recent project being the construction of the new bridge at Rapid Bay. Rachael commenced her time with Yankalilla in a role managing Records Management and Administration for Council and then as an Executive Assistant for the Chief Executive and Elected Members for over 10 years, while continuing to assist with all matters administration. Council wish both Peter and Rachael all the best for their future journeys, including their happy engagement.

Reports of Members, Delegates and Working Parties

Cr. Verwey reported that Uni SA are conducting research into Solar Evaporation and the conversion of contaminated, brackish, saline (including sea) water into drinking water. Cr. Verwey has contacted Uni SA and promoted Rapid Bay as a site for a pilot project. Discussions will continue with Uni SA.

Deputations

Sue Speck addressed Council in relation to the Tree Trail Signage Installations as part of the Heritage Fleurieu Coast Tree Trail proposed by the Normanville Natural Resource Centre.

Questions on Notice

Cr. Zarins questioned the Chief Executive in relation to legal action raised from residents of Cygnet Place to close the Rapid Bay Campground. Questions and Answers are listed in the Council Minutes.

Cr. Olsson asked questions in relation to the Second Valley Hall Precinct Verge Treatment Project, which will be commencing late May or early June 2021. A concept plan developed in 2019/2020 has been included in the minutes for information.

Motions on Notice

Cr. Rowlands was successful in gaining support to have the existing Normanville Beach access for vehicles remain open for the purpose of restricted boat launching and that action be taken as soon as practical for appropriate signage and required works. Discussions will continue with the Normanville Boat Ramp Users Group following the next summer season to address any concerns.

Reports

Chief Executive Report

The Chief Executive Report was received and it was confirmed that the owner of the Yurt Accommodation on Jervois Road has been made aware that they will need to submit a Development Application and On-Site Waste Application for the temporary occupation of the land during construction of the dwelling.

Council Committee Minutes

The minutes of the Audit Committee meeting held 10 May 2021 were endorsed by Council.

Rapid Bay and Expression of Interest for Management of the Rapid Bay Campground

A report was provided to Elected Members following a meeting with over 20 residents of Rapid Bay where the following topics were raised; Water Supply; the operations of Adelaide Brighton Cement; resurfacing Cygnet Place; Cygnet pyramid trees; use of foreshore area; cricket grounds and campground.

Council resolved to seek Expressions of Interest for the management of the Rapid Bay Campground, with consideration of various elements, and that the Expressions of Interest be presented to Council for

consideration along with the pros and cons of closing the campground.

Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority Business Plan and Budget 2021/2024

Council approved the draft FRWA Business Plan and Budget and Long Term Financial Plan subject to the availability to adjust items according to feedback from Council's draft 2021/2022 Annual Business Plan and Budget consultation. Council is putting forward to the community the suggestion that the fees at the FRWA Waste and Recycling Depot at Yankalilla increase by 10% and that the opening hours at the Depot decrease from 5 to 3 days per week, to reduce Council's costs.

Tree Trail Signage Installations

The Normanville Natural Resource Centre (NNRC) is proposing a Heritage Fleurieu Coast Tree Trail and Council has endorsed the placement of signage. Council will have ownership of the structures installed on public land and the NNRC will supply new information plates if required.

Council Response to Main South Road Duplication Consultation

Council support the State Government proposal to duplicate Main South Road from Seaford through to Sellicks Beach Road and have indicated a preference for an overpass at the Tatachilla Road/ Main South Road intersection. Council will write to the Department of Infrastructure and Transport requesting consideration also be given to improvements to Main South Road between Myponga and Yankalilla and will also request a passing lane for traffic to pass heavy vehicles coming off the Kangaroo Island Ferry.

Prudential Report – Jetty Caravan Park Upgrade

With the completion of the Section 48 Prudential Report for the Jetty Caravan Park Upgrade, Council noted the summary conclusion:

"The DCY has acted with due care, and high level of diligence and foresight in progressing the Project and Council has been provided with relevant information to satisfy the requirements of Council's Prudential Management Policy and Section 48 of the Local Government Act."

Normanville Foreshore Master Plan - Risk Management Plan – Update

Council at its last meeting resolved to update the Risk Matrix for the Master Plan. The updated documentation was presented to the Audit Committee and Council, both of which received the updated report.

Third Quarter Budget Review

Adjustments within the 3rd Quarter Budget Review were adopted as follows:

- Operating income increase of \$133,649
- Operating expenses decrease of \$34,442
- Decrease in the operating deficit of \$168,094
- Increase in the revaluation reserve of \$2,741,859
- Decrease in renewal capital exp. \$190,000
- Decrease in new capital expense \$570,000
- Increase sale of replacement assets \$18,182
- Increase in sale of Surplus Assets \$81,818

The improvement in the operating surplus is primarily driven by the record performance at the Jetty Caravan Park Normanville combined with lower than expected legal expenses.

These changes bring Council close to a break even result for the year.

Southern & Hills Local Government Association Audit Committee Exemption Motion

Council supported the S&HLGA to seek an exemption of the Ministerial Audit Committee exemption, this is not an exemption from an external audit requirement but rather the need to have a separate committee to oversee.

Southern & Hills Local Government Association Value Proposition

The S&HLGA Value Proposition Report was received which provided a summary of the past 4 years value for Council from its membership. Membership renewal will be considered as part of Council's Annual Business Plan & Budget for 2021/2022.

SA Representatives – Australian Coastal Councils Association Committee of Management

Council is a member of the ACCA and is asked to vote for candidates when vacancies occur on the Committee of Management. Two candidates were nominated and Council have submitted their vote for Marilyn Henderson as a South Australian representative.

Treasury Management Report

Council were provided a review of the loan liabilities and investments as at 31 March 2021 and resolved to receive the report.

Dog and Cat Registration Fee Approval

Council endorsed the Dog and Cat Management Board fees and charges for 2021/2022.

Regional Subsidiaries and Other Organisations/Entities

Council received the minutes of the Southern & Hills Local Government Association meeting held on 26 February 2021 and the minutes of the Fleurieu Region Community Services Advisory Committee meeting held on 13 April 2021.

Other Business

Feedback on the Normanville Foreshore and Jetty Caravan Park Masterplan was provided in the Council Agenda.

Mayor Rowlands Resignation from Presiding Member Position

Mayor Glen Rowlands advised that he will be stepping down as the Presiding Member (Mayor) as at the conclusion of the June 2021 Council meeting. He confirmed he will continue as an Elected Member until the end of the current term. Procedures to appoint a new Mayor will be carried out at the 15 June 2021 Council meeting.
