New Kerbside Collection Schedule for District Council of Yankalilla

The District Council of Yankalilla and the Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority are excited to announce a significant change to its kerbside collection schedule, set to take effect from July 1, 2023.

As part of our ongoing commitment to improving waste management services a local driver and truck will be based at Yankalilla and provide kerbside collections across the five weekdays. By implementing these changes, we can better serve the needs of our residents and maintain a cleaner, greener community.

This change means that most residents across DC Yankalilla will experience a change in their collection day, with the exception of Carrickalinga, Myponga and Myponga Beach, which remain a Monday.

What bins are collected together is also changing. General Waste bins will be collected the first week in July with Recycling bins (yellow lid) will now be collected with the Food Organics Garden Organics bins (green lid) in the second week.

This change will mean that some areas will receive two General Waste collections in a row, where their last collection in June is a General Waste.

Residents are strongly encouraged to familiarise themselves with the updated schedule beginning 1 July, and check if their collection day will change at the Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority website www.frwa.com.au.

Mayor Darryl Houston said, "It's great that we have a local driver with local knowledge collecting

our waste and recycling. It will also provide an opportunity to remove some bin banks in the rural areas and reduce the amount of litter in the environment."

Council and FRWA recognise that any change to established routines may require adjustment, and we appreciate the understanding and cooperation of our residents during this transition.

New Heritage Conservation Grant Program Now Open for Applicants

We are excited to announce that Heritage South Australia has launched a new Heritage Conservation Grant Program aimed at supporting essential conservation works at privately owned State Heritage Places. This program, initiated by Heritage South Australia, aims to provide financial assistance to eligible owners and organisations for the preservation and upkeep of historically significant sites throughout the state.

The Heritage Conservation Grant Program is a fantastic opportunity for owners of State Heritage listed places and those situated within a State Heritage Area. The new Heritage Conservation Grant Program will provide a total of \$2.5m in grants over a 10 year period – up from \$1.25m provided during the previous program initiated in 2018. The grant funds, provided on a dollar-for-dollar basis in most cases, can contribute significantly to the costs associated with conservation work or documentation, offering up to \$20,000 per project.



The Heritage Conservation Grant Program is highly competitive, with careful consideration given to various aspects of proposed projects. While the primary focus is on the conservation benefits, special attention will also be paid to projects that contribute to the public realm, activate under-utilised places, support specialised heritage training, provide economic stimulus, increase visitation to regions, that have been affected by the recent flooding event.

To ensure your project is eligible and to understand the assessment criteria in detail, we strongly

Applications for the Heritage Conservation Grant Program are now open and will close promptly at 2:00 pm on Thursday 10 August 2023. Please note that late submissions will not be accepted.

Major Projects Update

We are pleased to provide an update on Council's major projects. We encourage the community to visit our website for a detailed breakdown of the total budget of project expenditure for each project. All information is current as of the time of publishing.



Normanville Surf Life Saving Club and Café/Kiosk

The construction progress of the Normanville Surf Life Saving Club and Café/Kiosk is well underway, with several significant milestones achieved. In May, the first floor of the building saw significant progress, as the first fix services were completed, as well as the installation of scaffolding. This setup enabled concreters to pour the first-floor concrete slab on schedule. Blockwork for the first floor was also completed after the slab had cured and the installation of structural steel beams has begun, giving us a glimpse of the impressive scale of the building.

An important addition to the project was the installation of a new SA Power Networks transformer. Although not initially included in the project scope, Council currently have a \$158,000 underspend on the Caravan Park Cabins Project which (as per decisions by Council in the Budget Review process) will be re-allocated to the Normanville SLSC & Café/Kiosk project to cover the cost of the necessary transformer, pending confirmation on the final grant acquittal report.

As part of the leasing and activation process for spaces within the building, Savills Real Estate has made a formal approach to the market, seeking interest via an Expression of Interest (EOI) process. Interested parties have the opportunity to submit their proposals until June 27, 2023, to be considered for the Café and Kiosk tenancies. The Normanville SLSC lease is separate to this EOI process and Council are working collaboratively

with the club on a suitable lease arrangement. The EOI process includes a comprehensive marketing package with key leasing information for potential tenants. Once the EOI process concludes, a review panel consisting of various stakeholders will assess the submissions and make recommendations to Council for suitable tenants.



Big4 Normanville Jetty Holiday Park

The Big4 Normanville Jetty Holiday Park project is now complete, with only minor landscaping works remaining. The project has entered a defect liability period and during this phase, the contractor is responsible for rectifying any defects identified. Council's focus has now shifted to establishing future management models for the park.

At the May Elected Member Forum, the Director of Assets and Environment shared several management model options for consideration. Elected Members expressed the need for a detailed analysis, including financial modelling, which will be presented in the coming months. Council has received encouraging outcomes from Big4's performance report, with significant growth in revenue and bookings.



Normanville Foreshore

The boardwalk construction is now complete, except for the section adjacent to the new Surf Life Saving Club, which remains closed to the public until Stage 2 of the plaza works are finished. This boardwalk

has been designed to allow natural sand movement, which will cover and uncover it over time.

In May, the shade/shelter structure was completed after some amendments to ensure full compliance. The structure served as a perfect venue for the Normanville Foreshore community planting day, organised by the Fleurieu Environment Centre in collaboration with the District Council of Yankalilla and the Fleurieu Coast Community Nursery.

As previously reported, the resurfacing of the car park will be scheduled after July 2023 to minimise disruptions caused by the ongoing construction of the SLSC, Café, and Kiosk. Additionally, Stage 2 plaza works are expected to commence later this year, aligning with the opening of the new facilities.

Yankalilla Cultural Centre and Library

Library Build and Fit Out

A defects walkover revealed some outstanding issues that need rectification. Council and the project team are working closely with the builder to ensure all remaining defects are promptly addressed within the defect liability period.

Library Carpark

The construction and stormwater management aspects have been finished and ancillary works are ongoing. This includes stormwater infrastructure upgrades within the Yankalilla Youth Park and the reinstatement of landscaping and irrigation systems. The new turf is currently being established, and pathways between various park amenities are being formalised for convenience.

The boundary fencing around the reserve has been replaced, providing a clear delineation of the park's boundaries. In addition, Council has taken steps to preserve and relocate trees affected by the library construction, which will be reinstated within the Youth Park as part of ongoing works.

Tree Guard Recycling

Thanks to the collaborative efforts of dedicated volunteers, contractors and the YCA recycling facility, our corflute tree guards are getting a second chance at life, contributing to a more sustainable future.

Corflute Tree guards, contrary to popular belief, are not single-use plastic. These invaluable guardians of our coastal seedlings are being collected, sorted and reused, all thanks to the unwavering commitment of our community members.

Volunteers and contractors diligently gather the guards, ensuring they can be utilised again on future coastal projects. With proper care, some of these guards have proven their durability, enduring for up to an impressive 15 years!

However, not all tree guards can be reused indefinitely due to the challenges posed by wind and kangaroo damage, against which they valiantly protect our young seedlings. Nonetheless, we remain undeterred, as the guards that are no longer reusable find themselves part of an essential recycling initiative.

Recently, a trailer load of tree guards, collected from various project sites over several years, embarked on a transformative journey to the YCA recycling facility. There, Kai from YCA recycling informed us that the plastic sourced from these retired tree guards will be repurposed by

a manufacturer to create pots for our community nursery. What an incredible full-circle moment, as the guards that once shielded our young trees now continue their environmental contribution in nurturing new life!
