The Festival of Nature celebrates the Fleurieu Coast's communities and picturesque landscapes each Spring. After a cancellation in 2020 and a COVID-rescheduled 2021 event, the 2022 Festival of Nature has bounced back in a big way with over 30 events in the 10-day program.

Produced by District Council of Yankalilla and supported by Fleurieu **Environment Centre. The Festival** program not only featured guided walks, art, and environmental workshops but introduced new experiences including Science in the Pub and a First Nations cultural tour.

The major public event, the Outdoor Adventure & Eco Expo was rescheduled by a week due to inclement weather and was jointly held with the quarterly Kids Community Market. Council Group Manager, Lisa Pearson, said "This unexpected collaboration increased participation while celebrating our young entrepreneurs."

"It's great to see how nature-based activities and experiences can also be an impetus for the local community and we're keen to work together again in 2023," Ms Pearson said.

Carrickalinga Dark Sky Consultation

The Carrickalinga Ratepayers Association are progressing an application for Carrickalinga to become Australia's first Dark Sky Community.

In order to progress the application, it requires Council to adopt a Dark Sky Lighting Policy.

The Carrickalinga Ratepayers
Association and Council are working
together, and we invite you to
watch the video of Professor Chris
Daniels explaining the initiative, read
the FAQ's, view the draft Dark Sky
Lighting Policy and provide your
feedback via the survey.

The "Made by Nature" Fleurieu Coast community of Carrickalinga has only 38 streetlights. The upgrade of these lights can be achieved for little cost and effort and the Carrickalinga Ratepayers Association who are driving this proposal and will be responsible for all activities required

to receive a Dark Skies Communities Accreditation, including the cost of light shields, and working with Council on the development of a Dark Sky Lighting Policy.

Carrickalinga could then become the first Dark Sky Community in Australia. With less than forty such 'communities' in the world at this stage, this would be a great accomplishment indeed.

This initiative of the Carrickalinga Rate Payers Association aims to reduce light pollution, improve human and environmental health, and save both money and energy while reducing greenhouse gas emissions, so residents and visitors alike can enjoy the night skies into the future. Stargazing brings joy and wonder to all of us in different ways and the starry skies of the Fleurieu Peninsula are precious.



Dear aged care consumer

I am writing to tell you about important changes that will improve the safety and quality of aged

The Australian Government is concentrating on addressing key recommendations of the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety.

Some changes start on 1 December 2022. Aged care services will have to meet new requirements from that date. The Aged Care Quality and Safety Commission (the Commission) will have more powers to make sure that aged care providers meet their responsibilities. The changes that start on 1 December include:

- Improving the way aged care services are run through stronger governance requirements. This includes residential aged care services asking consumers whether they would like to have a Consumer Advisory Committee to give people who use the services a say in how
- A new Code of Conduct that describes how the people in charge of aged care services, and their aged care workers, must treat people receiving care. The Commission will have powers to take action where a provider or staff member breaches the Code.
- A Serious Incident Response Scheme applying to aged care provided in the home or the community. All providers will need to show that they have a systematic approach to minimising the risk of things going wrong and can respond quickly and effectively if something does go wrong that affects a consumer. Home care providers will now also have happen again. (Residential aged care providers are already required to do this.)

There will be more changes during 2023, including improved Aged Care Quality Standards.

The Commission will work with aged care providers to make sure the changes are made smoothly. Your service provider should keep you updated about what they are doing

You do not need to do anything in response to this letter. We will provide more detailed information for people who receive care and their families closer to 1 December. If you would like to stay in touch with us, you can visit our website and subscribe to the monthly Aged Care Quality Bulletin.

I hope this letter has boosted your confidence that your aged care provider, and the Commission, are working hard to ensure that you will have the best possible experience of aged care.

Recycling & Green Waste Collections to Double Over Summer

To help our community recycle more, FRWA and council will now double the collection of yellow Recycling and green Food Organics Garden Organics bins over the six week summer holiday period.

The six WEEKLY collections of Recycling bins and Green bins (in eligible townships) over the peak of summer will be on your normal collection day and begin the week of 19th December 2022 and finish the week of 27th January 2023.

Please note that General Waste to Landfill bins (including those with any EC Exceptional Circumstances bins) will continue to be collected fortnightly during this period.

Over the six week Christmas and New Year holiday period, recycling and food waste increases, therefore it is important to provide more capacity for residents to use their recycling and green bins during this time.

This change will Increase waste disposal capacity by more than 200% over the six week period, providing an increase in service to residents who generally have more materials to dispose of. For those residents outside of townships that do not have a green bin, there is still an increase in capacity with weekly recycling collections instead of the smaller general waste to landfill bin.

This change follows a two year investigation into the best way to provide more opportunity for households to recycle more and reduce waste sent to landfill, with the majority of extra waste generated over the Christmas/New year period

being food and packaging. Don't forget, food waste can now go into your green bin, along with your garden waste, and please ensure only compostable bags are used, available at a reduced price at councils and the Fleurieu Regional Waste depot in Yankalilla, Goolwa and Strathalbyn.

The change will provide a significant increase in capacity of waste disposal, even for those with only a weekly recycling collection (see attached graphic showing OLD/NEW capacity).

Council Decisions
