Yankalilla Library Receives \$250,000 Grant and The Green Light to Proceed

On 12 October 2020, Federal Minister for Mayo, Rebekha Sharkie announced that she had secured, through the Federal Budget, \$250,000 to “fit out the new purpose-built library space”. “The new library will have improved mobility access, more engaging, multi-use spaces and will be fitted out with upgraded technology”.

The process to find a permanent home for the Library has been ongoing since 2014, over six years. At the October 2020 Council Meeting, the historic decision was made to provide that much needed

permanent home for the Library by approving the concept plans and appointing a Working Group to take the concepts plans to fruition.

Mayor Glen Rowlands said, “Council has made the decision to push on with building the extension to the Centre at 181 Main South Road to accommodate the Library”. “To get to this point it has been 6 years, lots of discussions, consultation and recommendations from the Community Library Advisory Group to build a concept plan”.

After listening to community

feedback and unsuccessful grant funding applications, Administration commenced investigations into a lesser sized building that fits within the remaining allocated budget of \$883,500. The concept plans illustrate a New Library build of 314 sqm gross and a new outdoor deck area of 51 sqm gross.

Council staff have been working with a local Building Designer to scope the project and will focus on utilising local contractors and the Depot Team to perform the build and fit-out, to keep as much money in the local economy as possible.

CEO's Corner

Ask the CEO (Nigel Morris)

Q1: Can you give me an update on the three-story half built house on Gold Coast Drive Carrickalinga? - Karen

The current structure was deemed to be built too high and there is currently an outstanding court order that requires the height of the building to be lowered. There was previously a planning application lodged to lower the building to the correct height and although this application was previously extended it has now lapsed. Council did not approve a further extension to this application and this decision has been appealed in Environment, Resources & Development Court and is currently in process. There is also an application to demolish the building, this application remains active and can be enacted upon by the applicant at any time. We will provide a further update once the most recent appeal before the Court has been finalised.

Q2. Does a register exist of significant trees in the Rapid Bay Area?, If so can I please access it? - Sia

The Council does not have a register of individual trees, located in the District. Trees are collectively managed in our District by the requirements of:

- The Native Vegetation Act (administered by State Government) sets out the requirements in relation to the preservation, enhancement and clearance of native vegetation in the District both on private property and in public areas.
- Council's Tree Management Policy which provides the requirements for the management of all trees under the care, control and management of the Council (i.e. located on public roads and reserve areas).

Q3. What is the update on the Rapid Bay bridge construction? - Sia

The designs for the new raised bridge at Rapid Bay have been completed and the project is currently out to

tender. It is envisaged that on-site works will commence in early 2021 following the summer school holidays.

The new bridge will be located immediately upstream of the existing crossing, which is to remain in place, during the construction process, to maintain vehicular access.

Council recently received \$297,000 Federal Funding to fund 50% of the bridge. This will greatly assist with the project.

Q4. Is there a possibility of reopening the presently closed road through Croziers property to the Rapid Bay township? As I am led to believe it is closed due to damaged bridge. Reconstruction of the bridge or replacing it with a walk bridge would improve access and enjoyment of Rapid Bay. - Sia

Given its condition the old bridge was previously closed to traffic. Engineering assessments have recommended it not be opened for pedestrian movement, as the remedial work to revitalise the bridge would not be a cost-effective exercise.

To provide a new bridge at this location could cost \$200,000 to \$300,000 for a pedestrian only bridge or approximately \$800,000 for a vehicle bridge.

The new bridge at the foreshore is being raised to provide suitable protection from flood inundation, it will also include a separated pedestrian walkway. Once this work is complete it will provide the campground, oval, school and residents with suitable vehicle and pedestrian access, without the need to provide a duplicate access to the location.

Q5. Is the council aware that a public announcement is imminent regarding the Main South Road and Willis Drive intersection at Normanville and that it is to be upgraded? I have been advised that things are in motion for a change to the intersection and I will be notified of the announcement soon. - Des

The Main South Road and Willis Drive intersection is on a State Government Road. Council has been advocating for improved safety and traffic flow at the intersection for a number of years. The State Government have advised us that they will continue to investigate Council's and the community concerns but are yet to provide formal advice on what may happen at the intersection. We will advise if any announcements are received.

Q6. Is it correct for the mayor to say in the council newsletter that the council is creating "Community Titles" on the foreshore and caravan park?

Is council only classifying the titles as community land and not making community titles and could this be corrected in the next newsletter? There is a major difference between the two terms community land and community title. - Des

For clarification, the land on the foreshore should be referred to as Community Land.

Community titles are used to describe a form of property ownership that has been divided into at least two lots and have shared common property.

Under the Local Government Act, all Council land is classified as community land unless an exclusion applies, this means that all land (unless an exclusion applies) should be referred to community classified land and not community titled land.

All of Council's Community Land is detailed within the Community Land Management Plan (CLMP) found on Council's website.

Chief Executive Report

Council noted the three Grants totalling \$847,000 received from the Federal Government for our Major Projects:

- Forktree Road Sealing \$300,000
- Yankalilla Library – Fitout new purpose build Library \$250,000
- Rapid Bay Bridge Replacement \$297,000

Council noted that all Council Offices / sites will be closed from 12noon on Thursday 24 December 2020 and reopening at 9.00am on Monday 4 January 2021, and will operate using out of hours services.

Council Committee Minutes

Council received the minutes of the Fleurieu Regional Assessment Panel meetings.

New Library Project – Approval of Concept Plans and Establishment of Working Party

Council endorsed the concept plans for the New Library and will proceed to the detailed drawings and tender phase. A new Library Build Working Party will be created to evaluate the tender responses (within budget) and be involved in the major decision making and variance and milestone signoffs throughout the construction phase. The Working Party consists of Mayor Rowlands, Deputy Mayor Rothwell, Chief Executive Nigel Morris, Chief Operating Officer Andy Baker and Library Team Leader Sandra Skinner. The President of Community Library Action Group (CLAG), Ross Trigg (or proxy) will be invited to join the Working Party.

Council will proceed to the construction phase if the Working Party determine that the outcomes of the tender process are favourable (within budget and meeting requirements). Updates on the New Library Project will be included in the monthly Elected Member Forum and monthly Chief Executive Report to Council.

Proposed Community Land Management Plan for Consultation – Second Valley Springs

The Community Land Management Plan for the Second Valley Springs was endorsed to go out to Public Consultation.

Revocation of Community Land Classification Finalisation and Sale – 7 Para Avenue, Cape Jervis

Council received approval to revoke the subject land from its community land classification from the Deputy Premier and approved the Chief Executive to dispose of the land. Following the completion of the sale process a further report will be provided to Council on the proposal to construct public toilets at the Cape Jervis Community Centre with

any remaining funds be provided to the Cape Jervis Community Recreation and Sporting Club Inc to use for projects as agreed with the Council to enhance the community space.

District Council of Yankalilla Disability Access and Inclusion Plan for Adoption

Council adopted the District Council of Yankalilla Disability Access and Inclusion Plan and will now submit it to the State Government Department of Human Services.

New Year's Eve Trail – Request for funding from Community

Council allocated \$875 cash and in-kind printing to support the Community led 'New Year's Eve Trail'.

Savings and Efficiency Program Update

Council noted that over the last five years that operating expenditure has on average increased at a rate at less than 1% per year (less than inflation).

Civic Awards Policy Review

Council adopted the amended Civic Awards Policy.

Fleurieu Futures Reports and Neighbour Council Collaboration Status

It was resolved that an update of the convened meeting of Mayors and CEOs of the Councils of Yankalilla, Victor Harbor and Alexandrina to discuss the potential release of the Fleurieu Futures reports, and what future collaboration would look like, be presented to a future Elected Member Forum.

Micromobility Options - E-Bikes

Administration will continue to pursue off-road cycling commercial partnerships and opportunities based on e-bike touring, hire and transfer in our region.

Road Naming Policy for Review

Council adopted the amended Road Naming Policy.

FRWA Launches New Pre-Booked Kerbside Collection Service

Do you need to have an out of cycle or extra (2nd or 3rd) kerbside bin collected occasionally at your house, holiday rental or other small business?

Fleurieu Regional Waste Authority (FRWA) has launched a new pre-booked general waste collection service which allows for the collection of extra bin(s):

- out of usual collection cycle - when you need to have a general waste bin (or 2) emptied, but your kerbside collection is recycle bin only;
- collection of a 2nd general waste bin in cycle with usual general waste collection - when your kerbside collection schedule is general waste, but you need to put a 2nd or 3rd general waste bin to be emptied.

Pre- booked general waste collection services will be available in most of the District Council of Yankalilla on Mondays and Fridays (frequency may increase over summer holiday period).

FRWA also offers:

- 12, 9, 6 and 3 months Additional Bin Collection Services which can be purchased from FRWA and may be more cost effective for properties which require regular additional bin collection services;
- Standard garbage bags or 140L bin of general waste can be taken to one of FRWA's Waste and Recycle Depots at minimal cost.

\$847,000 in Grant Funding Announced

Good news has come in three this month with announcements that Council will receive \$847,000 in grant funding for three of our major projects. The funding announcements are a result of Council getting projects to a 'Spade Ready' status. These three projects have been many years in the making and it is exciting to see their progress to this point.

Grant Funding for Yankalilla Library

On 12 October 2020 Council received official notification from Federal Member for Mayo, Rebekha Sharkie of \$250,000 Federal Funding received towards the fit-out of the new purpose built Yankalilla Library.

Grant Funding for Rapid Bay Bridge

On 6 October 2020 Council received notification of successfully receiving

\$297,000 (50% funding) for the Rapid Bay Bridge from the Federal Government.

Grant Funding for the sealing of Forktree Road

Council has now been notified of its success in the Special Local Roads Program funding of \$300,000. The 2020/21 Annual Business Plan and Budget allocated \$150,000 towards the project, subject to receipt of \$300,000 grant funding, which now allows the project to proceed in 2021.

At this stage it is estimated that the multi-year project breakdown of costs between Council and expected grant funding from Special Local Roads Program (SLRP) is as follows:

Student Art Exhibition

A unique art show at the Yankalilla Showgrounds over the October Long Weekend came together organically in response to COVID restrictions, people were creative, generous and supportive. The event was sponsored by the Fleurieu Refugee Support Group and had over 100 entries from across the Peninsula.

Compassion, creativity and clarity of message were outstanding in the artwork from our children and youth, untainted by inhibition and reflecting Australian values of fairness and harmony.

Every entrant was a winner judging by the reactions of over 200 visitors. The three judges struggled to separate out entries with greater merit, but at the end of the day, along with a People's Choice, there were 14 prizes of cash, vouchers and goodies donated by our community, Rebekha Sharkie, Moira Jenkins, Glen Rowlands and locals Linnett and David. The amazing Awesome Foundation donated \$1,000 in recognition of the value of the event to the Fleurieu community.

Overall, the day was a delightful mix of art and music in a friendly, welcoming atmosphere. The cooperation across the Councils and Schools of the Fleurieu was heart-warming.



Old Normanville Service Station Site Update

The new green space in the centre of Normanville is set to open for the October long weekend.

The public amenities are now open and have been renovated with pride by our depot team members, including our own electrician,

plumber, and tiler.

The green space is a short-term solution for the site. The community will be consulted on the long-term future use of the site.





\$40,000 Grant Upgrades the Yankalilla Community Nursery

The Yankalilla Community Nursery was established to grow local native plants for coastal community projects and large-scale carbon offsetting revegetation with species recovery aims. The District Council of Yankalilla has provided a separate compound in the Council depot for volunteers to grow local native plants under the supervision and guidance of Corey Jackson, Council's Coastal Conservation Officer. The volunteer base through the Normanville Natural Resource Centre has increased through a series of grants with Conservation Volunteers Australia aimed at community participation.

The Yankalilla Community Nursery has grown from a small operation growing 2,000 - 4,000 seedlings to this year growing over 15,000 seedlings in just two growing seasons. We have undertaken upgrades as opportunities arise, but the facility is lacking key features for volunteers such as toilets, hand

washing and food areas.

Council's Coastal Conservation Officer has successfully gained a Bushfire Recovery Nursery Infrastructure and Assets Grant of \$40,000 from the Foundation for National Parks & Wildlife to fund a portable toilet with hand washing facilities that will be based onsite at the nursery and will be used for community planting events. Plumbing at the site will be improved to include a permanent washing area with a sink and have separate food preparation and eating areas. A planting trailer will be funded to facilitate moving large numbers of plants and materials allowing for more plants to be planted at community events.

An expansion and upgrade of the growing areas will occur because of this grant that will double the capacity that can be grown for community environmental projects.
